The disorderly fellow waits for the last-minute rush and comes in on it like a surfer. He doesn't ask if something is 100 per cent cotton or 100 per cent wool. If it's 100 per cent cloth, that's close enough. He has his coat open, his hat tipped back and his money in his fist like a Las Vegas dice player. He doesn't ask about warranties, he doesn't keep sales slips, and he is pitifully grateful for any sort of advice. Salesladies love him.

Orderly people put up their outside lights weeks in advance. At least the ones on our street do. My wife is unhappy because I seldom get ours up until the 24th. So I compromise. I leave ours up until the end of January. Now who's cheerful? I ask her. She never seems to have an answer. And, believe me, it's those days after Christmas when you really need cheering up.

Orderly people can't understand disorderly people. They would like to teach them to be orderly, too, and are baffled when their offers are turned down. "All right," they say, "if you don't mind having your life such a mishmash, just keep on the way you've been going." Well, shoot, life is a mishmash any way you look at it—at Christmas more than ever. Christmas is the World Series of mishmash.

Orderly people keep lists. This seems to be what they like best about Christmas. Lists of names, addresses, favorite colors, sizes, what they sent you last year, what

Friona Flashbacks

....from the files of The Friona Star

60 YEARS AGO--DEC. 25, 1926

The front page of the Star carried an article tracing the growth of the Friona school system during the preceding five years, from a three-year to a four-year high school; from five teachers to eleven; from three buses to eight; from 98 students to 300; and from ten grades to eleven.

55 YEARS AGO--DEC. 25, 1931

Owing to the 12 inches of snow which covered the ground Thursday morning of last week, the school buses were unable to get to school from the various parts of the district. Only three of the ten buses were able to make the trip Friday, and for this reason there was a very small attendance at the Christmas program which the departments of the school had prepared.

50 YEARS AGO--DEC. 25, 1936

Canyon's high-flying Eagles made off with the first place trophy in the Friona Invitational Tournament which closed here Saturday night. The Chieftains gave them a mighty battle in the final game, before losing by the heart-breaking margin of 28-27.

45 YEARS AGO--DEC. 26, 1941

Entirely satisfactory was Friona's response to the Red Cross relief call, according to a report made this week by J.R. Roden, roll call chairman in Friona. Roden reports that Friona raised \$11.72 more than its \$300 quota--a much better showing than in some of the larger cities throughout the state, he says.

40 YEARS AGO--DEC. 20, 1946

The new uniforms for Friona High School's band began arriving last week, and four of the twirler uniforms have also arrived, according to D.G. Holmes, superintendent of the Friona Public Schools. The uniform fund

was helped by a \$100 check from Leo Potishman of Fort Worth.

Wayne B. Stark, son of Mr. and Mrs. W.B. Stark, has received his discharge from the service, and is now at home.

35 YEARS AGO--DEC. 20, 1951

Work is speeding ahead at the Sloan Osborn A No. 1 test drilling location ten miles northwest of Friona this week, with actual spudding-in anticipated tomorrow or Saturday. Whether or not oil is found in this exploratory well, local citizens may have the assurance that a really "big time" rig is being used on the location, with the most modern equipment available.

30 YEARS AGO--NOW. 20, 1956

Friona is fairly popping with new, modern service stations. The T&H Texaco Station has been open little more than a month, and now three more are about ready to enter the race for retail trade. They are a new Gulf Station at Main and Highway 60, a new Phillips 66 Station, which has been leased to K.E. Deaton, and a new Humble Station, at the intersection of Highway 60 and North 214.

25 YEARS AGO--DEC. 21, 1961

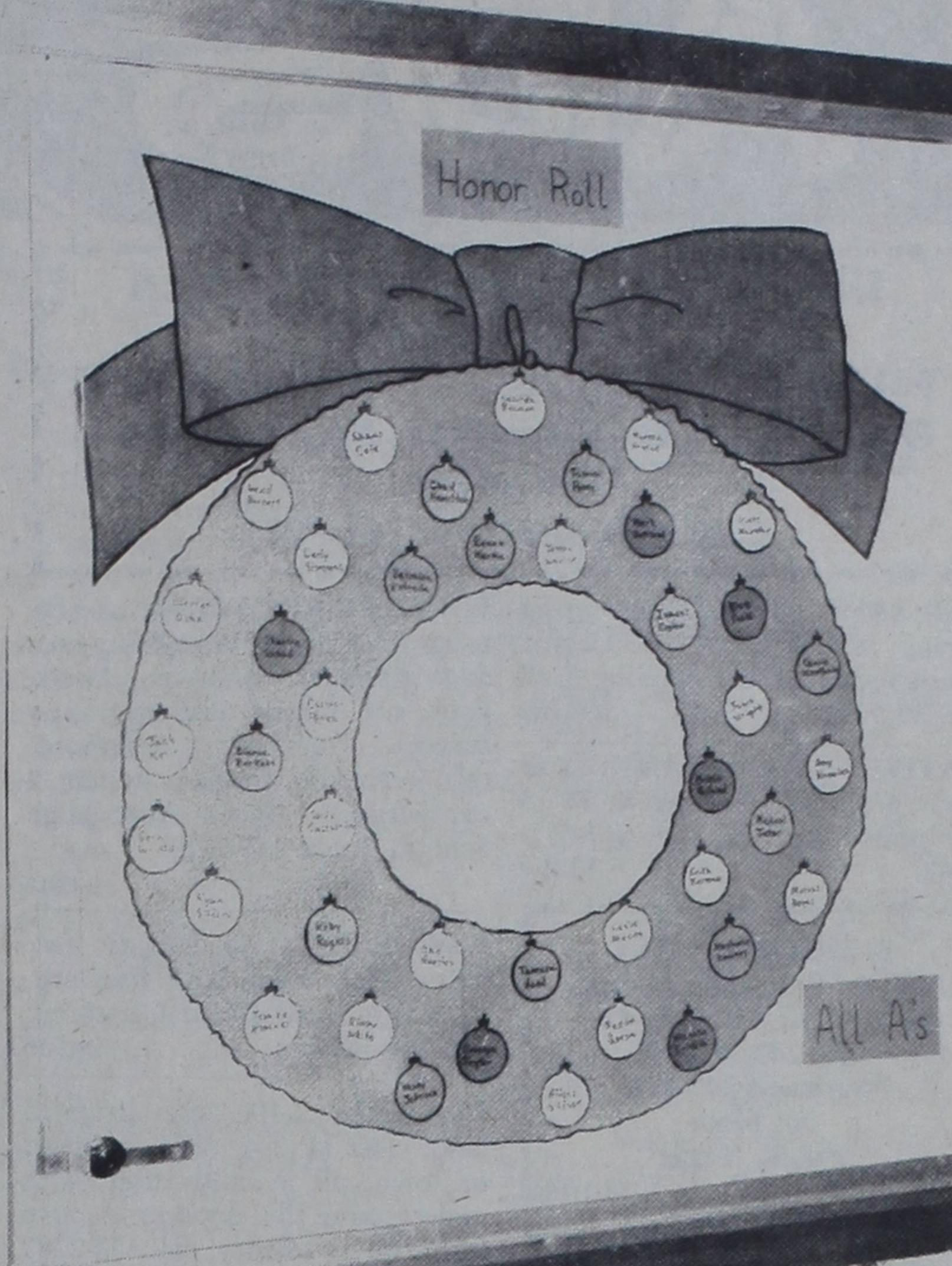
Included was one with his name, which read as follows:

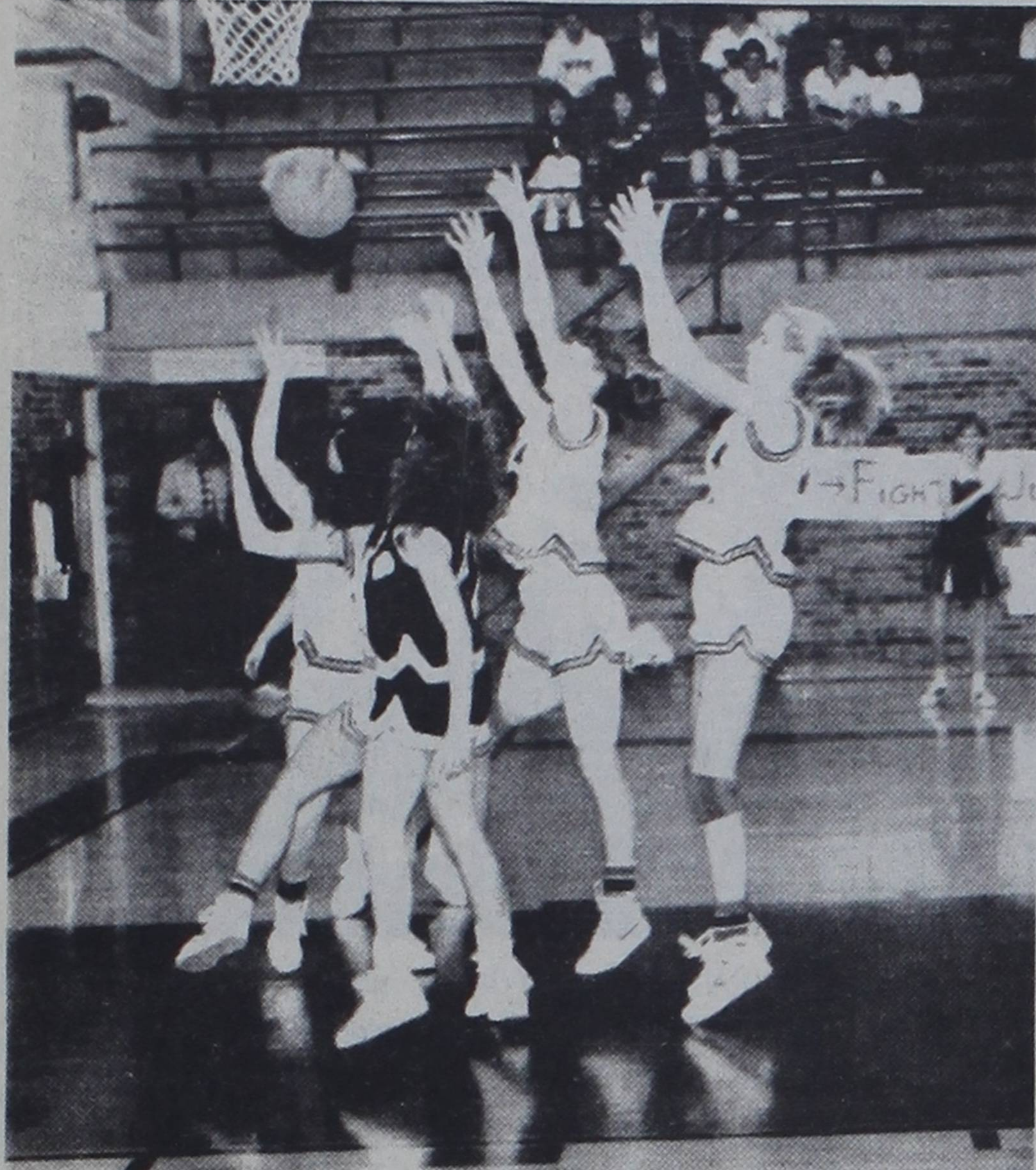

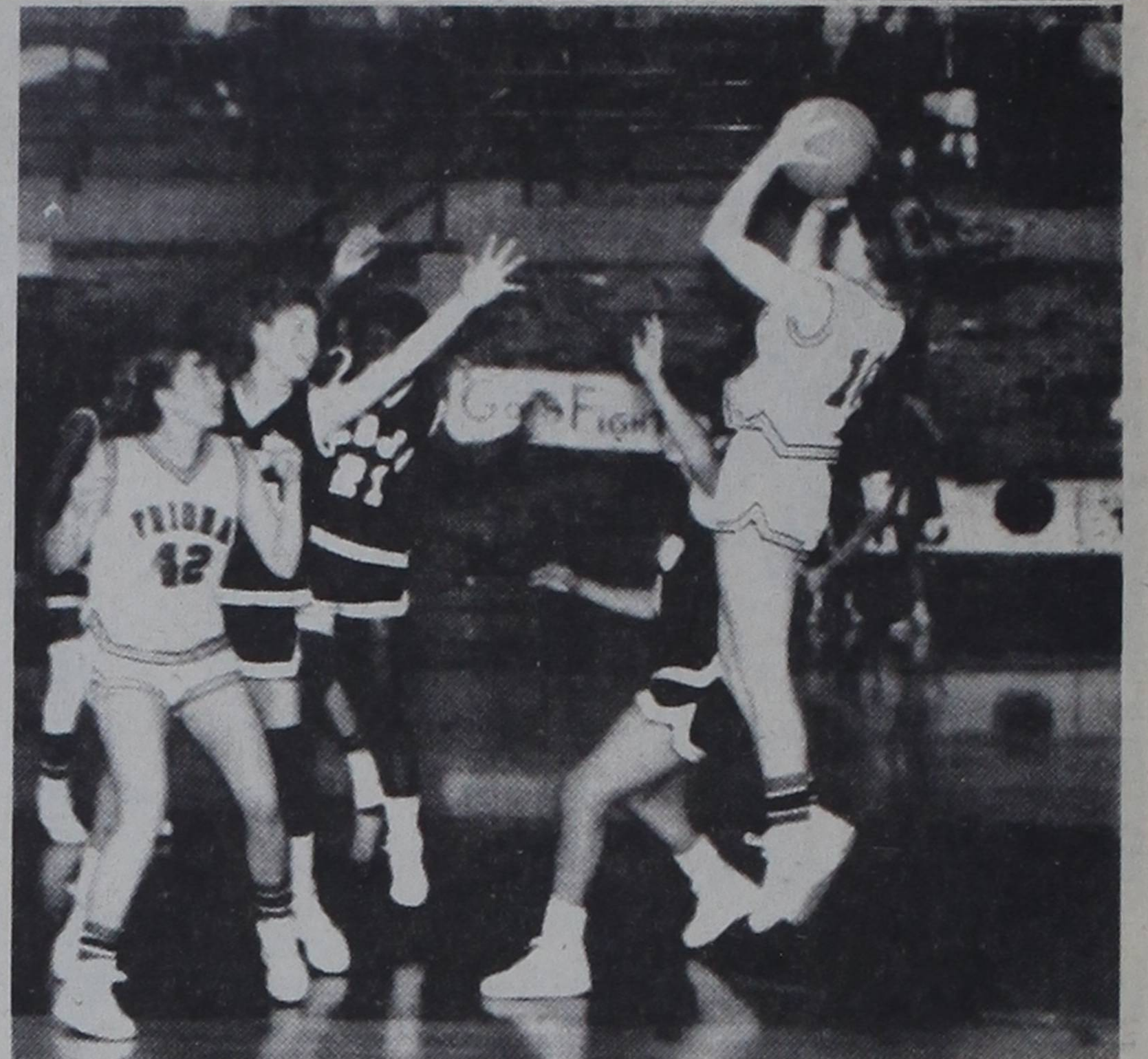
The Friona-Abernathy game is slated for 4:30 p.m. on Monday, December 29, at the Lubbock Monterey gym.

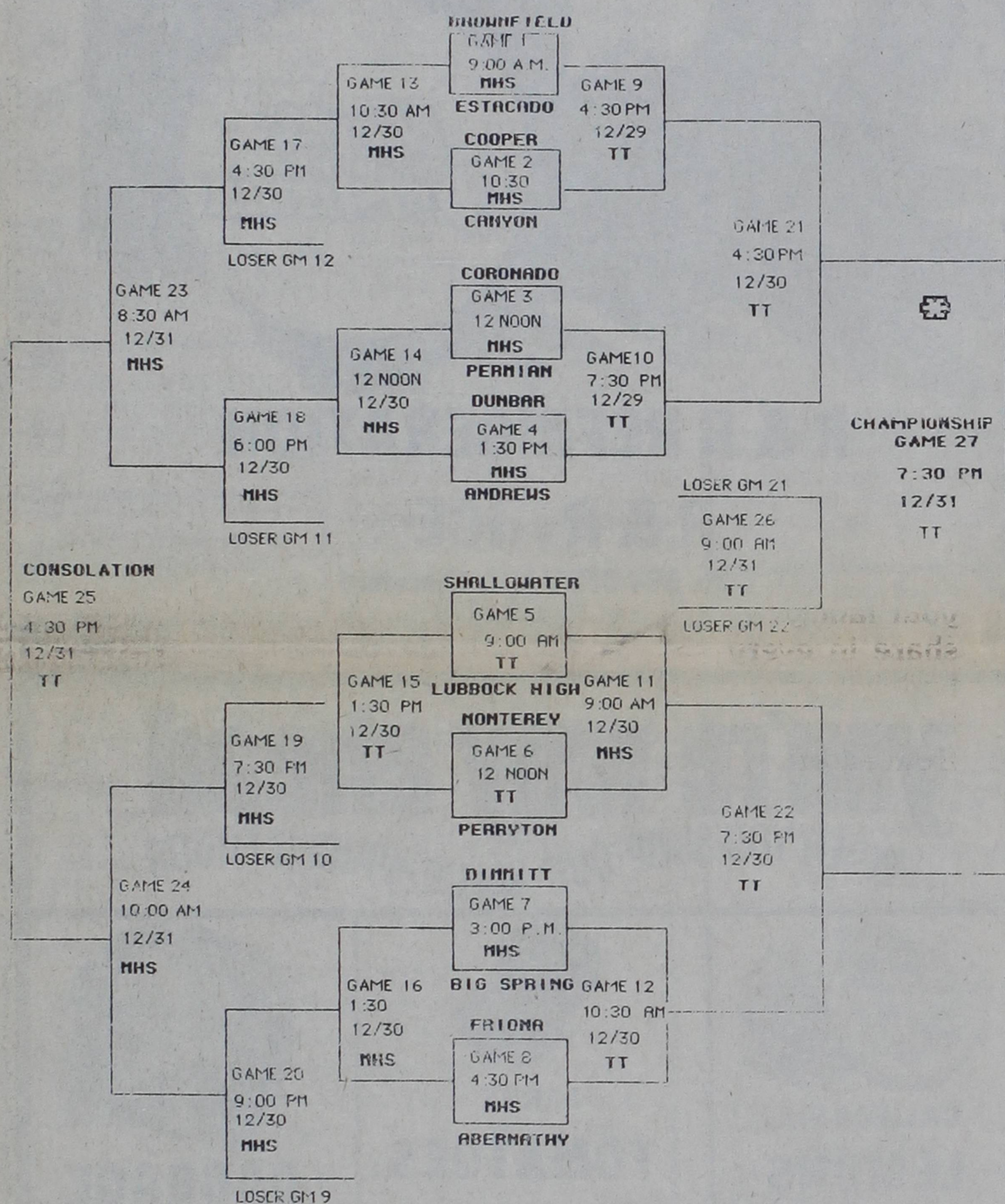

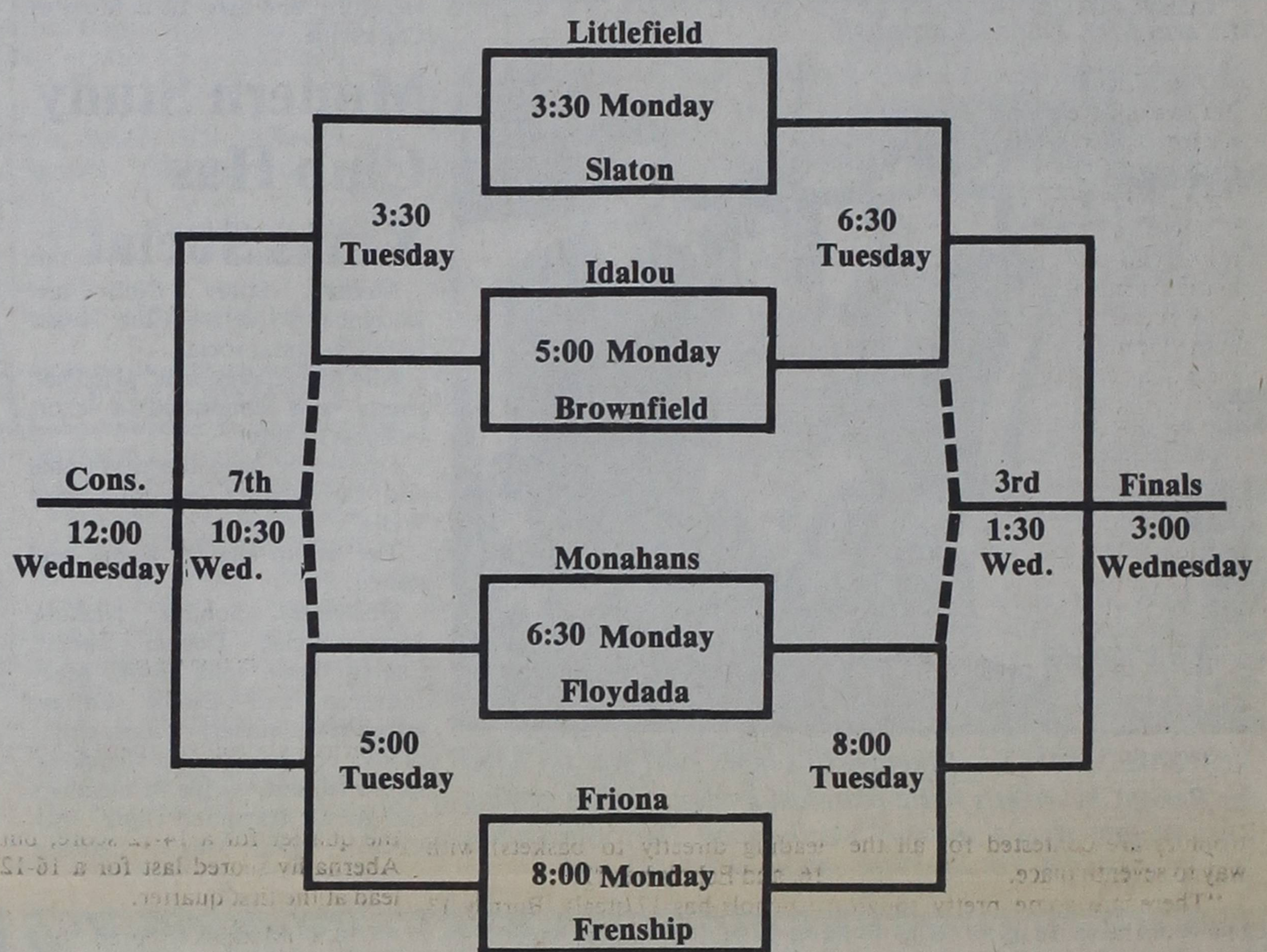

Abernathy Ends Squaws' Winning Streak At Nine

In a battle of two playoff teams from last season, the Friona High School Squaws saw their nine-game winning streak snapped by the Abernathy girls here last Friday, 46-45.

Inability to hit free throws cost the Squaws their tenth win of the season, as they hit only seven of 16 for the game, and missed seven of 12 attempts in the second half.

Three times in the final quarter the Squaws had a player at the line for a one-and-one free throw opportunity, and all three times the player missed the first shot. Once, they even had a second chance, after a line violation was called against Abernathy, and still missed the shot.

In the meantime, Abernathy's all-state player Mikki Webb sank four of four free throws in the fourth quarter, including two with 40 seconds left which wrapped up the game for the visitors.

Abernathy was the state champion last year in class AA, and has the best team that the Squaws have faced so far this season.

Ronda Ratcliff broke loose for a layup shot after 1:07 of play in the opening quarter, for Friona's only lead of the game, 2-0.

Miss Webb quickly countered for Abernathy with a pair of baskets, giving Abernathy a 4-2 lead with 5:10 left in the quarter.

Glenda Ellis hit a jump shot from the side for a 4-all tie and after Abernathy answered, Miss Ratcliff hit a turning jump shot for a 6-all score. She repeated her shot a minute later for an 8-all score with 2:02 left in the period.

Abernathy scored a pair of baskets, and the Squaws never were able to tie up the game again in the half, being close on several occasions.

Lacye Osborn broke Abernathy's full-court press for a layup for a 12-10 deficit, and repeated with 14 seconds left in the quarter for a 14-12 score, but Abernathy scored last for a 16-12 lead at the first quarter.

Mika Maddox scored on a driving layup to open the second quarter, and was fouled. She completed the three-point play with a free throw, to bring the Squaws within a point at 16-15.

But the Antelopes scored three unanswered baskets to take a 22-15 lead with 6:15 left in the half.

The Squaws missed a couple of fairly close shots that just wouldn't fall, and finally, Sindy Preston, who had come off the bench, sank a long jump shot to get Friona back on the scoreboard and a 22-17 deficit.

Miss Webb's basket inside the final minute gave Abernathy a 28-20 lead, but Shannon Atwell made a layup shot before the buzzer to cut the lead to 28-22 at halftime. Abernathy took a nine-point

lead, their longest, at 32-23 early in the third quarter. Glenda Ellis canned a jump shot, then stole the ball and drove for a layup, cutting the lead to five, 32-27.

Miss Maddox' follow shot made the score 34-30 with 3:49 left in the quarter, and Miss Ratcliff sank a jump shot with 1:17 remaining for a 34-32 deficit. Usually a reliable free throw shooter, Miss Ratcliff missed both ends of a two-shot foul at the 51-second mark that would have tied the game.

Julie Cain missed a free throw at

the 21-second mark, and two rebounded shots by the Squaws rolled off the rim, as Abernathy kept its 34-32 lead at the quarter break.

Miss Osborn sank a layup to give the Squaws their only tie of the second half, 34-all, to begin the fourth quarter.

Miss Webb scored three points for a 37-34 Abernathy lead, and Miss Maddox answered with two free throws and a 37-36 score.

Abernathy went on top, 42-36, and Miss Ratcliff made a three-point play (basket and free throw) to trim the edge to 42-39 with 2:10 left in the game.

Abernathy went to the line for a pair and a 44-39 lead, but Miss Osborn's jump shot made it 44-41.

That's when Miss Webb was fouled, and sank both shots with 41 seconds left for a 46-41 lead.

But Miss Preston sank a jump shot with 21 seconds left, and after a turnover, Miss Maddox hit a turning jump shot for a 46-45 deficit with nine seconds left. But that was as close as the Squaws could come to pulling out the win.

Both teams had 14 field goals, and Abernathy hit one more free throw, hitting eight of 13 from the line.

Miss Ratcliff led the Squaws with 12 points, Miss Maddox had

11 and Miss Osborn scored ten. Friona did a good job on the boards. Miss Osborn grabbed nine rebounds and Miss Ratcliff added five.

The junior varsity game was almost a dress rehearsal for the varsity game, as Abernathy won, 45-44, handing the Squaws' JV their third loss against nine wins.

Friona led, 22-21 at the half, and it was all tied, 33-33, after three quarters.

Lori Fulks led the scoring with 18 points and Tiffany Osborn added nine.

Free throws also sank the JV Squaws. They hit only 14 of 27 attempts, while Abernathy made 15 of 24 shots, and that was the difference.

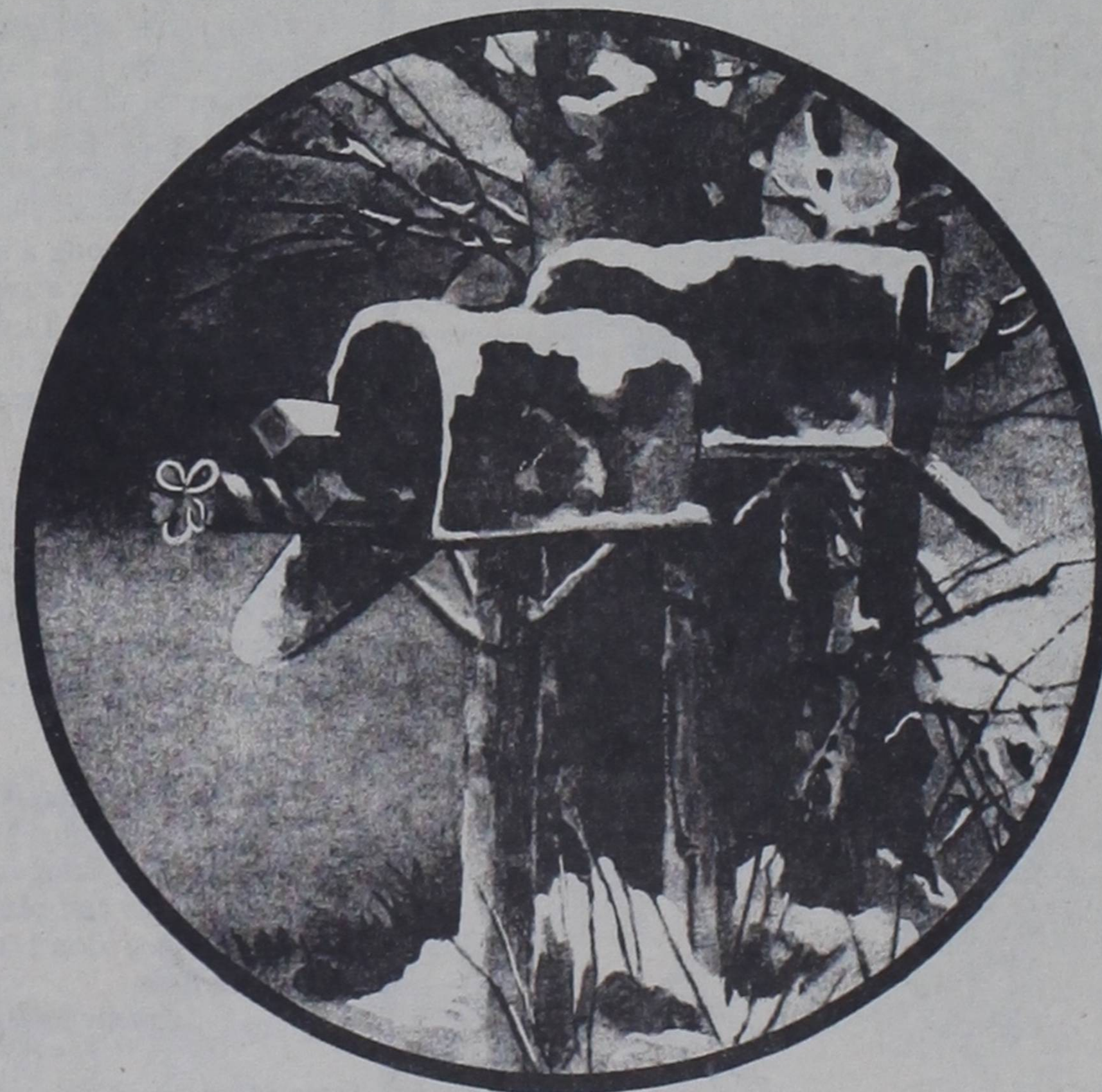

Besides Friona, only Amarillo High School, Hereford and Palo Duro, all playoff teams, had as many as two players on the elite team.

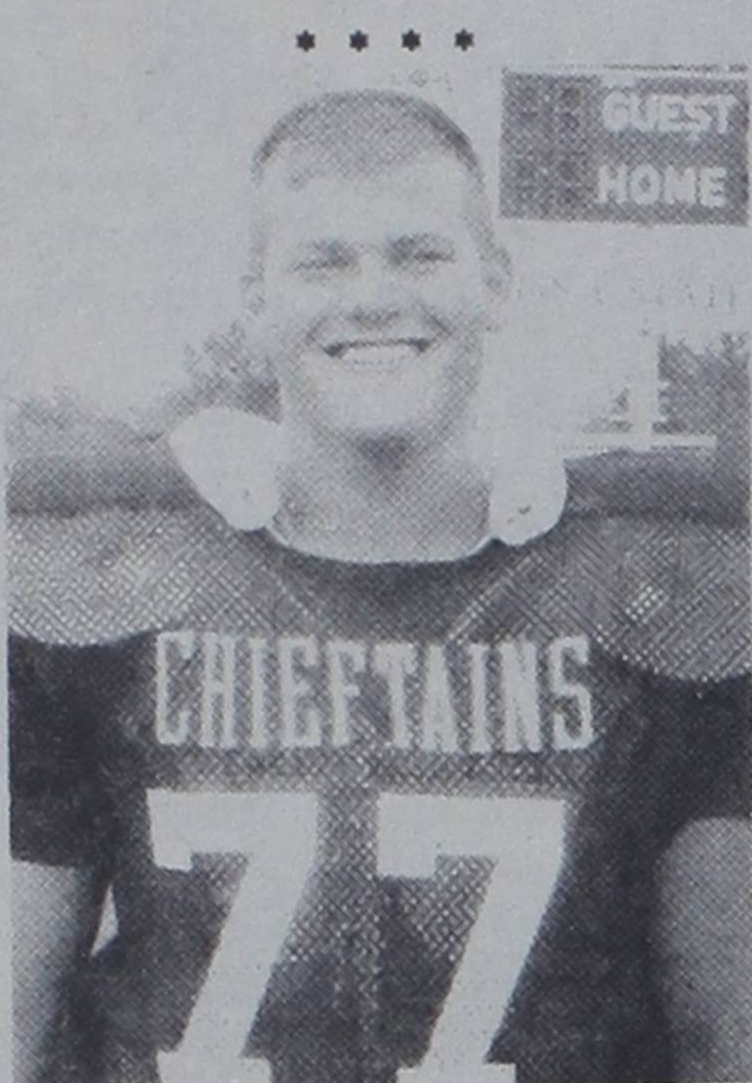
The only other District 2AAA player chosen was Dimmitt's Milton Carrasco, chosen at a defensive lineman's position.

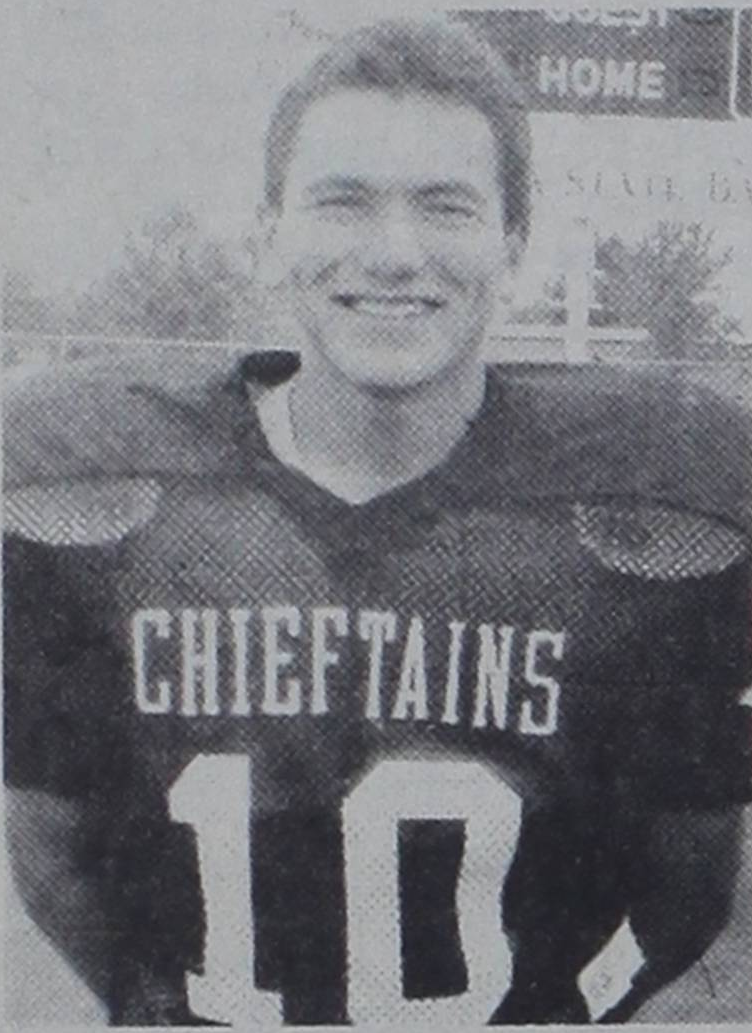
Chaney was chosen as an offensive tackle on the dream team, and Montoya made the offensive team as its place kicker.

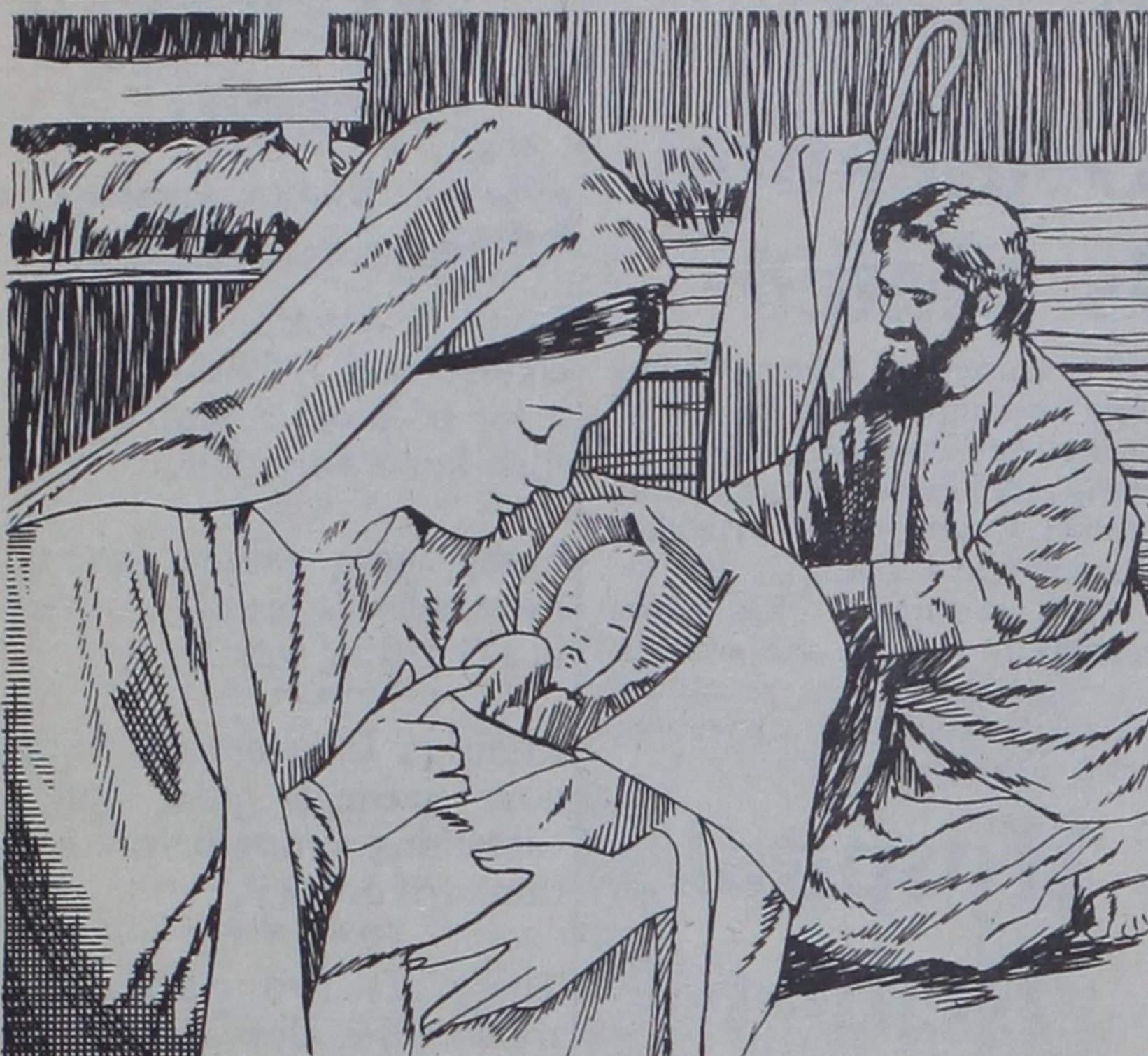
