that said slaves are usefully omployed, so that they may, if practicable maintain themselves and not becone a charge to my estate or a nuisance to society. ag:orany infirmity be unab'e to masintain themselves, my exocutors are further directed and required to pay orer to such of them sieves, or such of them as may of twenty-five dollars per year. in such amounts and at such periods of the year as my executors may or shall deem ;necessapy . It is my further will, and I $d 0$ direct, that my man Tom be permitted to reside at Pleasant Retreat aslong as he may live under the care and management of $m y$ executors, and employed, a such a way as may be most agreeable to him.

I do not desiga by the forecoing provision to attempt to emansipate the aforesaid slaves Julliet, Sally, Billy.
