Thousands of childran and adults die every year from dis eases carried by the fly, Typhoid Cover, cabereulosis, summer complaias, enolera, indy frequently death follow clesely in the trail of the trail of the common house fly.

The control of the fly menace comes at the top of the list of aecestary public health meas ares which ahould be applied by every eity and community in the 3tate" urges Dr. J, W.Brown 3tate Health officer.
"The mest effective measure for control is to prevent breed fag' he said, Flies breed in filth, and about eight days are reqqired to complete a lifecycie. Dering her lifetime :of several months one house fly lays from coe wity seen that in as season
whiel usually begins in spring of the year, to descendans from one fly laumber countless thou sasds.
'Trejeliminate flies the breeding places must be destroyed; Ma aure piles, garbage, and other organic filthgfurniah the require ments of warmth, moisture and food neeessary for the propaga cion of the fly. Flies should be keptifrom contact with food or drink or utensils in which such food and drink are prepared and ervee, Likewise they should be tept from access to privy vaults where they piek upinfec tion, which theylater spread to humans by contact with the food and drink and by
hands and utensils.
