### Big Turnout Here Vital For Buske

A big turnout of voters in Friona on Tuesday, April 10, is vitally important to the area.

Voters showed their interest last Wednesday when more than 100 local voters turned out to vote absentee in the Democratic runoff election.

Now, it is up to the rest of those who did not vote absentee, to make their appearance at the polling place.

Voters need to realize that the next time the Friona Fire Department, or the Friona City Council needs to go before the commissioner's court with a request, that they usually have a better hearing if they have a friendly face in the county judge's seat.

In recent days, voters in the Friona area have indicated an interest in coming together to back their Friona candidate, who clearly has all of the qualifications necessary for the county judge's position.

As a former Friona mayor who helped shape the city's sizeable budget, and with college training in law and business experience in finance, B.K. Buske is ready to serve his Parmer County neighbors.

Let's give him that opportunity. Let's all turn out and vote on Tuesday, April 10!

### FHS Sweeps Win In District UIL

Friona High School ran away with the team trophy in the District 2-AAA UIL literary meet, concluded at FHS last week.

Friona compiled a total score of 399 points, to 273 for Tulia; 214 for Muleshoe and 211 for Dimmitt.

As a result of their expertise, FHS students qualified to participate in 19 events in the regional literary meet. They also won four first alternate spots, four second-alternate rankings, plus won points in four other events.

Kelley Cash and Krista Renner won first place in team debate, and James Warren took first place in Lincoln-Douglas debate.

In poetry interpretation, Heather Griffin and Mindy Johnson placed 1-2 to each qualify for regional, and Mark Madrid was first alternate.

In news writing, Krista Renner and Erika Bermea placed first

and second, and Terron Talley was named second alternate.

In number sense, Friona won the team award, as James Warren, Mark Madrid and Kristen Holland did the honors. Individually, Warren placed first and Madrid second.

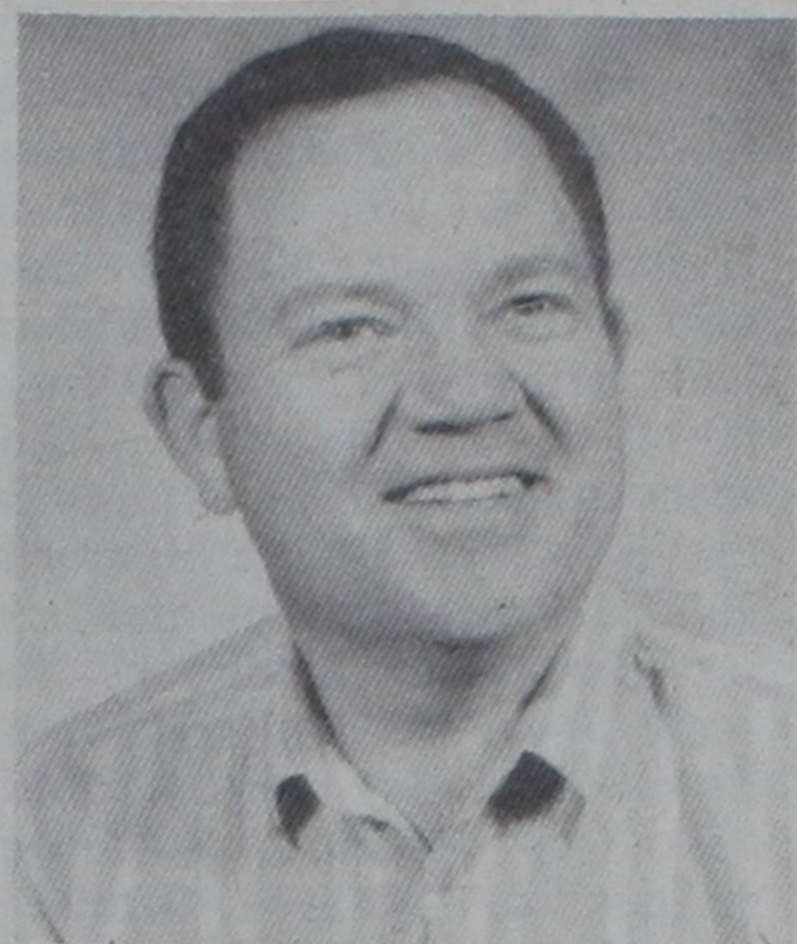
Friona High School also swept the ready writing event, where Krista Renner and David Garcia placed first and second.

In literary criticism, Mindy Johnson placed first and Kelley Cash third, both qualifying for the regional meet.

Madrid also won first place in accounting, where Sandra Alvarado tied for first alternate, and John Edd Duke tied for second alternate.

Martha Aronce placed second in feature writing to win a regional spot. Rick Perkins placed sixth in this event.

### TOMMY HANCOCK Hancock Is Named Jr. High Prin.

Tommy Hancock was named principal of Friona Junior High School for the 1990-91 school year at a special meeting of the Friona Independent School District Board of Trustees on Tuesday, April 3.

Hancock has nineteen years experience as a classroom teacher. He served as a Vocational Agriculture teacher in Canadian, Olton and Floydada. He has been an eighth grade science teacher at Friona Junior High School the past four years.

He is a graduate of Borden County High School and received his B.S. degree from Texas Tech University in 1970. He received his Master of Education degree from Texas Tech in 1973, and has completed all requirements for his certification in mid-management from West Texas State University.

Hancock was selected from a field of forty applicants. Superintendent Hal Ratcliff stated, "We had a number of outstanding applicants. It is nice when you have someone in your own district who is qualified for the job. The Board believes Tommy has the potential to be an outstanding principal."

Tommy and his wife, Stacy, have two children. Keith is a 1988 graduate of Friona High School and a sophomore at Texas A&M University and Cammy is a senior at Friona High School.

### Absentee Vote Sets Record

County Clerk Bonnie Warren Howard said Thursday that a total of 103 people voted absentee in the special booth at Friona Credit Union on Wednesday. Of the total, 101 voted in the Democratic runoff, with two casting Republican ballots.

That number by itself would be a new record for primary absentee voting for a county election. Mrs. Howard said that with those who had cast absentee ballots this week at the courthouse, there had been approximately 150 absentee ballots cast.

## Judge's Race Tops Democratic Runoff

The runoff election will be held Tuesday, April 10, with the county judge's race holding the most interest for local voters.

Bonnie Clayton of Bovina and B.K. Buske of Friona face in the runoff for nomination as Parmer County Judge. They were the leading vote-getters in the five-person field in the Democratic primary on March 13.

At the top of the Democratic ticket is another "battle of the sexes," where Jim Maddox and Ann Richards have been sparring for the nomination for Governor.

Maddox was the leading vote-getter in Bovina and Parmer County in the first primary, and the two candidates were almost dead-even statewide. They have been wooing the voters who were for former governor Mark White the first go-around.

In another race, Tom Bowden and Nikki Van Hightower square off in the state treasurer's race, Bob Gammage and Ross Sears are opponents for Justice of the Supreme Court, Place 2, and Amarillo's Morris Overstreet and Frank Maloney are opponents for the judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1.

In the Republican runoff, where a much lighter turnout is expected, Wes Gilbreath and Grady Yarbrough face off for the nomination for state Land Commissioner, and Rick Perry and Richard McIver are opponents for the state Commissioner of Agriculture nomination.

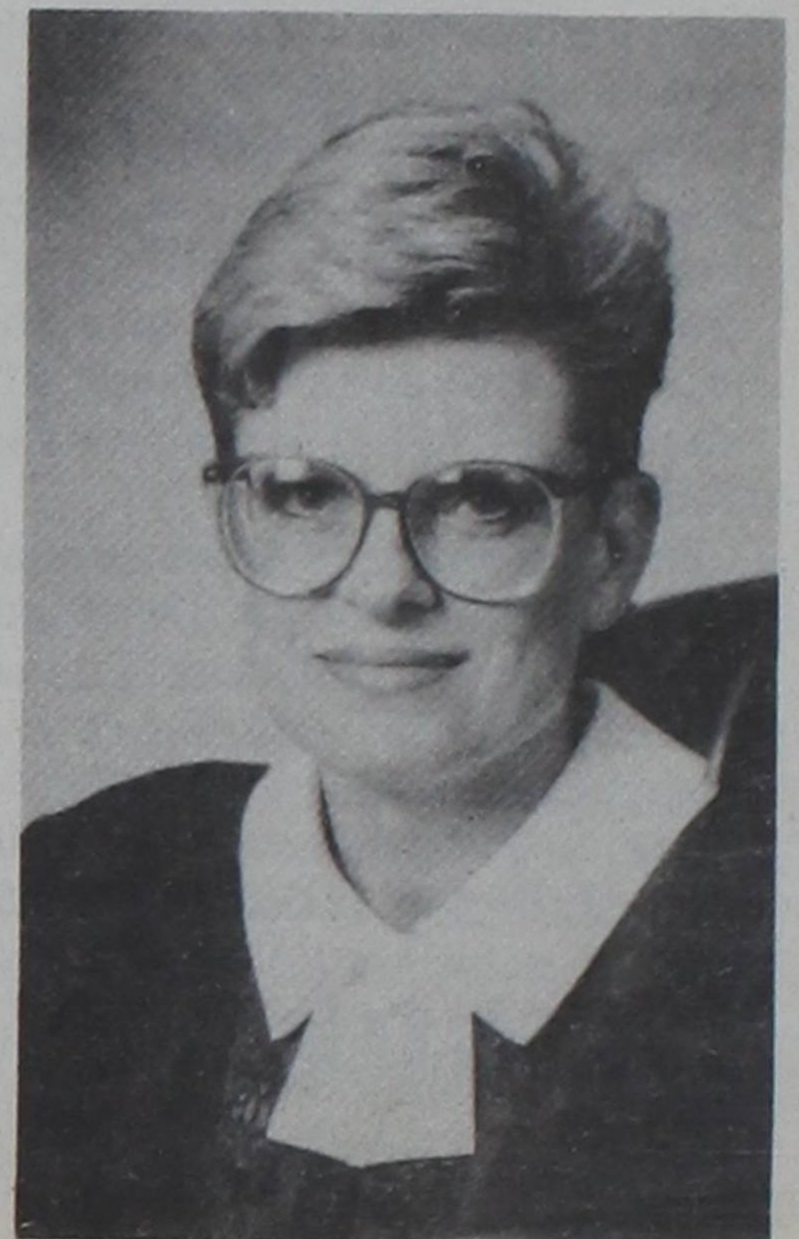
Polling places are the same as during the first primary for the Democrats. Bovina voters will cast ballots at the old American Legion Hall.

However, Chris Gikas, County Republican chairman, said that only one polling place will be operated in the county for the GOP runoff, and it will be located at the Farwell City Hall.

Anyone may call or write Gikas for an absentee ballot if they cannot vote in person, he said.

## Citizens Honored At Chamber Fete

The Friona Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture honored the outstanding citizens of the community at its annual banquet here Monday evening.

Barnett has lived in the Friona area all of his life, being a graduate of Friona High School where he was active in football, basketball, track, student council, FFA and others. After graduating from

Texas Tech, he returned to Friona to live.

He has served on the Chamber's board of directors, the Little League board, Parmer County Tax Appraisal District board, and Board of Equalization. He served on the Friona School Board for several terms, and was board president for a number of years, being instrumental in the bond issue for school improvements.

Barnett has also served on many boards and committees in the First United Methodist Church. He is also on the board of directors for the Parmer County ASCS, serving as president, and is a member of the board at Friona State Bank.

The Woman of the Year was also raised in Friona. She is a graduate of Friona High School and Texas Tech. She has served as an officer in the Chieftain Parents organization, and as a member of the Friona Library board.

Mrs. Riethmayer was also a board member for the Friona Women's Division of the Chamber, serving in several capacities such as banquet decorating, coffee cart, Miss Friona or Little Miss Pageant. She has served as hostess to visitors in Friona.

She served recently as president of the American Cancer Society chapter, and is currently secretary of the board of trustees of the Friona Independent School District.

Loy McLellan has taught in the Friona elementary school system for the past 15 years. One of her nominations said, "She is a good friend and a loyal co-worker. No fifth grader whom she has taught has gone to the sixth grade without a very personal word of encouragement from this very dedicated teacher."

Mrs. McLellan is a graduate of Texas Tech University. She is active both in and out of the classrooms. She has been actively involved with Friona Youth Basketball, as a coach and as a board member and president of the board.

She and her husband have served as class parents for many high school classes, even after their children had graduated.

Sterling Graham is maintenance foreman at Parmer County Community Hospital. He was born and raised in Oklahoma, but moved here shortly after graduating from high school. Graham and his wife lived for awhile in Oklahoma, but have lived in Friona for the past 34 years.

Bonnie Israel, a senior at Friona High School, has been a member of the National Honor Society,

A 20-year-old resident of Friona, Allison Precure, was dead on arrival at Lubbock's Methodist Hospital following a two-car crash near the SIB Gin south of Friona. Hurt critically in the wreck was a Hub community man, Roy Bridgeman, 36. The victims were taken to West Plains Memorial Hospital in Muleshoe and later transferred to Lubbock. The accident occurred about 7:45 p.m. Both vehicles were totally destroyed. Precure, a lifelong resident of the area, attended school at Lazbuddie and Muleshoe. He was employed at Missouri Beef Packers in Friona.

**15 YEARS AGO--APRIL 6, 1975**

The City of Friona has called a \$350,000 bond election for Tuesday, April 22, for the purpose of constructing a 60-bed nursing home facility in Friona. The city council called the election in a special meeting of the council Monday, March 31 with the nursing home steering committee. Jim (Hack) Corbell, 37, escaped

with chest injuries after his plane was totally demolished on the Bruce Parr farm east of Friona around sundown Monday, March 31. The setting sun was the factor in the crash, as Corbell, an employee of Benger Air Park, did not see a sprinkler system on the wheat he was spraying for green bugs.

**10 YEARS AGO--APRIL 13, 1980**

The City of Friona has called a new election for the position of mayor, following an unusual turn of events during and following the annual city election last Saturday. In the election, 84 voters wrote in Charles Caudill for the mayor's position, with the incumbent mayor B.K. Buske receiving 55 votes. Caudill declined to serve, however, leaving the city without an elected mayor.

The City of Friona's 1980 census mail return percentage looked "real good," Bill Soule, manager of the 1980 census office for this area, said Wednesday. No census figures can be released at this point, but the district census chief said that judging by the number of returns, Friona's 1980 count could top the 4,000 mark. Friona's

official count in 1970 was 3,111.

## Tryout Date Set

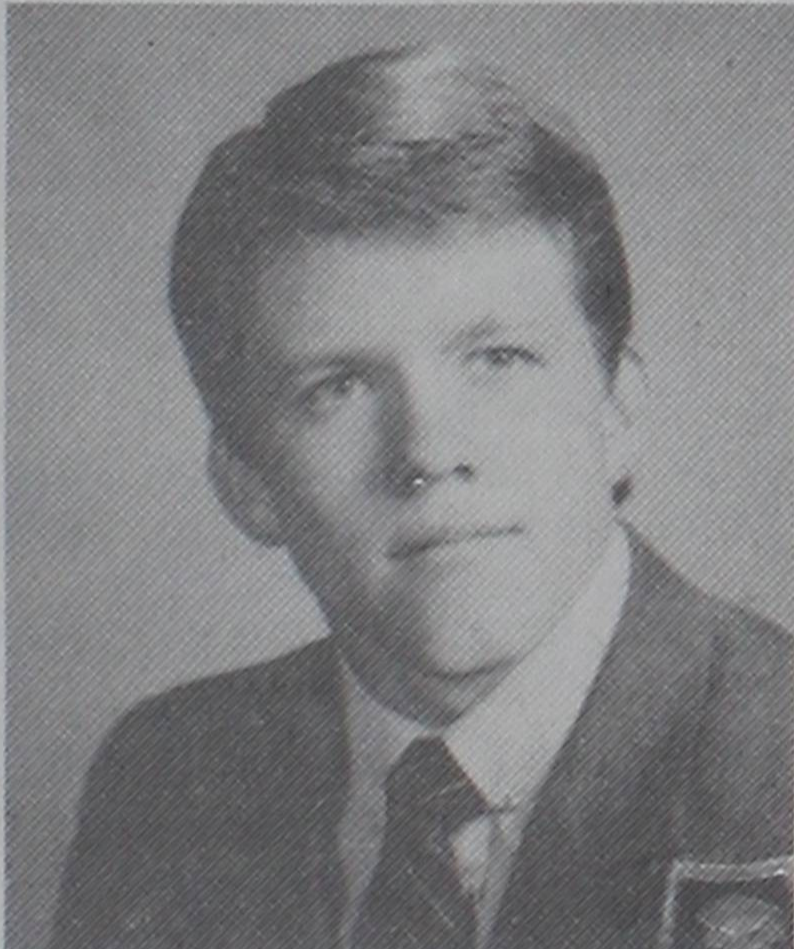

Jessica Smith was sixth in the 800-meter run with a 3:04.9 clocking.

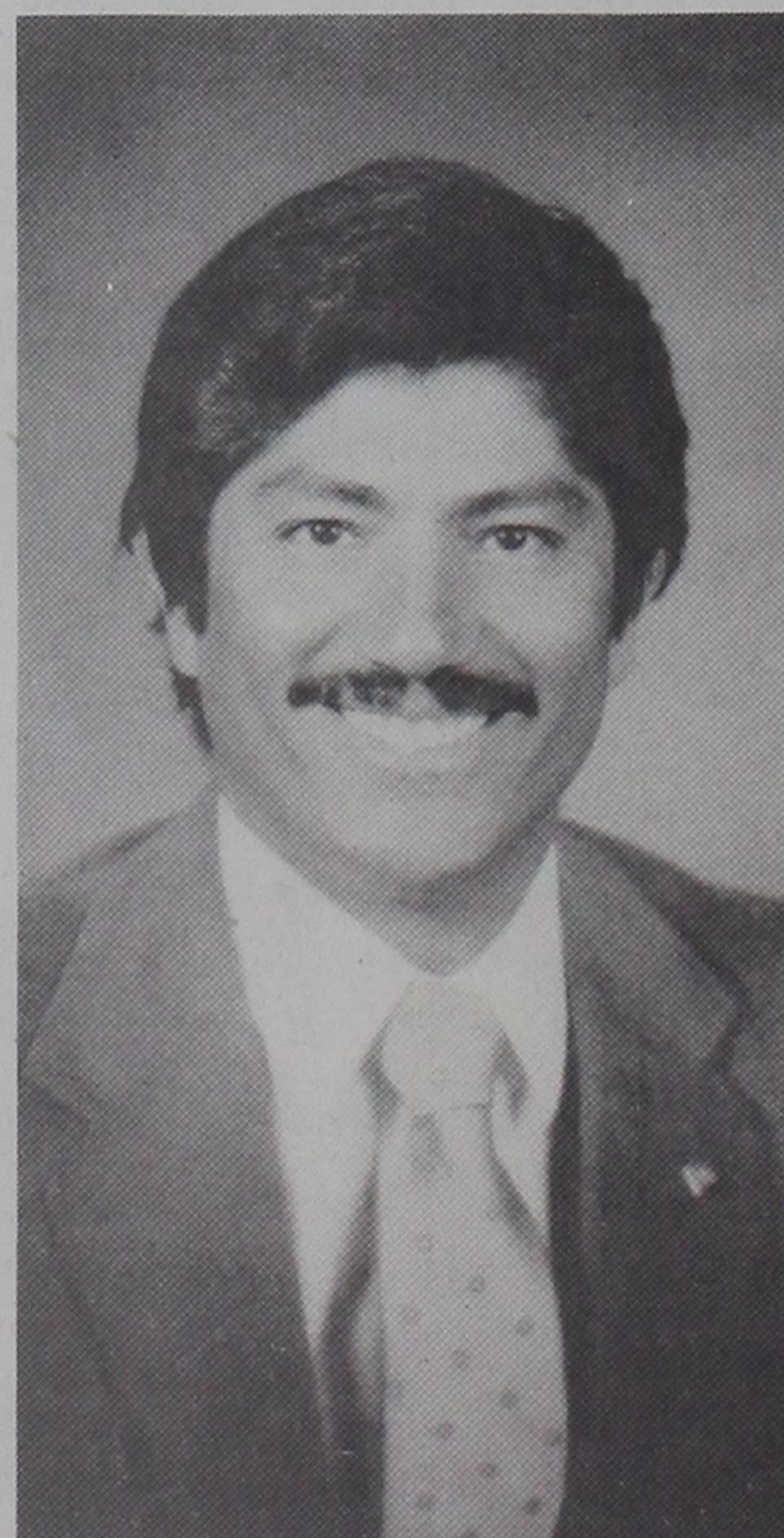

Friona placed sixth overall in the meet. Most of the district schools, along with Bovina, competed.

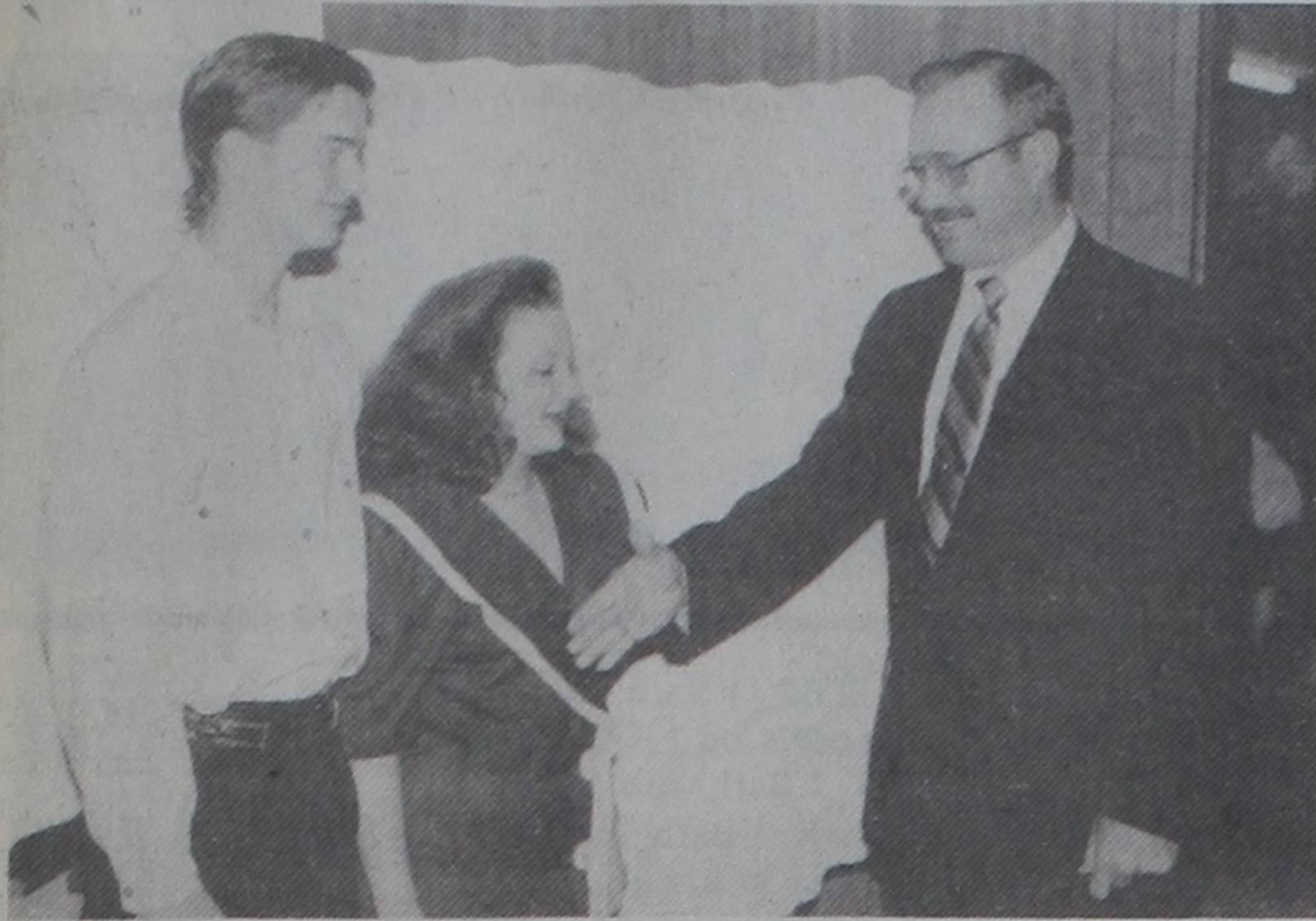

## Childers: S.S. Job Very Rewarding

At the age of 22 most people are graduating from college and thinking of a career. Kathryn Clark Childers at 22, had graduated from college and was packing a .357 magnum in her pocketbook, as she was one of the first five women selected as a special agent for the U.S. Secret Service during the Nixon administration.

Her assignment was the White House.

Childers, now the wife of a Corpus Christi psychiatrist, mother, and an 11-year hostess of a TV talk show in Corpus Christi, gave a very interesting and entertaining presentation to the 34th annual Friona Chamber of Commerce Banquet Monday evening at the community center.

"I was surprised, and took great pride in being one of the first of five women Secret Service Agents charged to protect the president, the vice president or foreign dignitaries," she said.

It was a serious job for many reasons, but Childers said it helped to have a sense of humor as well.

Childers said, "I was a little terrified of the responsibility, when learning that a lot of the training was on what could happen, or play it by ear."

Childers explained, "At first a woman agent was hard for the men agents to accept, but the tougher I got the more they began to accept me." Her dream in college was to work in Washington. She had not counted on making waves in the men's law enforcement world, she added.

Her big break came one day when giving a tour of the White House, which is regular duty for Secret Service agents.

"I was told one day that I had a foreign dignitary assignment. With whom, I asked? Wit: Queen Sophia of Spain, I was told."

"I was assigned to spend the entire day next to Queen Sophia. I was in a receiving line with her--not just for her welfare; for her comfort, also."

Later that afternoon, she was asked if she would attend the White House dinner in the queen's

honor. They told her to be back at the White House in an hour.

That was not enough time for her because she didn't have an evening pocketbook big enough to pack a .357 magnum, badge, handcuffs and six rounds of ammunition--all required to be on her person at all times.

Traveling all over the U.S. she stuck with the Queen, even when her highness chose a well known Texas upscale store to buy, of all things, costume (fake) jewelry.

The assignment that the agent called her most interesting was protecting Caroline Kennedy. She spent three years with Caroline, and found herself in some very exotic places.

"Caroline didn't much like the protection, but she had it until she was 16," she said.

Mrs. Childers said, "I am very grateful for this opportunity I had in my life. The job was interesting and very rewarding, but I really enjoy most what I am doing now."

## Fuel Cost Recovery To Lower Bills

Southwestern Public Service Company's (SPS) Texas retail customers will receive lower rates beginning in April due to an interim reduction in the "fuel-cost recovery factor" on electric bills. The decrease will lower overall electric rates 9.6%, or \$43.8 million, for residential, commercial, industrial and other retail customers.

The reduction, which was requested by SPS in November 1989, was approved this week on an interim basis by a hearing examiner with the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The fuel cost collected by the interim factor will be subject to final review by the commission.

The amount of the decrease will vary according to usage and rates applicable to different types of customers. Texas residential customers using 1,000 kilowatt hours a month on SPS's standard rate will see their monthly electric bills decline by \$5.07.

This reduction is the result of lower fuel and purchased-power expenses. The cost of fuel to operate SPS power plants, plus the cost of power purchased from other companies, makes up about half of SPS's overall costs to serve customers.

"Our industrial electric rates already are among the lowest in the nation, and this reduction will put SPS's Texas service area in an even stronger competitive position to retain and attract industry and jobs," said Bill Helton, SPS president and chief operating officer.

SPS also is passing on the savings to its customers in New Mexico, Oklahoma and Kansas through the regulatory procedures applicable in each state.

## Diabetic Camp To Be Operated

Every summer, over 300 young people between the ages of 6-18 attend a very exclusive camp near Gainesville. The entrance requirements are strict: the child must have diabetes.

Too often, regular summer camps turn away a child with diabetes because of their special diet and medical needs. But Camp Sweeney, organized over 40 years ago, is a place for the child to learn while having fun. All of the activities of a regular summer camp are offered: horseback riding, swimming, boating, fishing, arts and crafts, riflery, archery, movies, dances and carnivals.

At Camp Sweeney, a 24-hour medical staff skilled in the knowledge of juvenile diabetes, gives campers supervision and attention. At daily medical lectures, the campers learn the vital importance of balancing their insulin intake, and their diet in order to live longer, healthier, and happier lives.

Diets are formulated according to each individual's needs, giving the diabetic valuable examples of how to exchange foods to include an occasional "treat" so he won't feel left out around his friends at home.

Camp Sweeney is located ten miles northeast of Gainesville, near the Oklahoma border. Camp facilities include six air-conditioned cabins, lodge, hospital, and various staff cabins and a pavilion where arts and crafts and rainy day activities such as country and western dancing are enjoyed. Camp Sweeney also has two tennis courts, basketball/volleyball courts,

soccer and baseball fields, a swimming pool, horseback riding, archery, riflery, and a 34 acre lake where the children enjoy paddle-boarding, canoeing, rowing and fishing.

Camp Sweeney has never denied admission to any child with diabetes. The only requirement is to have diabetes and be between the ages of 6-18. Each year approximately 75% of all campers receive scholarship aid which is funded by donations from friends, Foundations, and United Way Agencies.

The first three-week session will begin on June 10 and end on June 29; session two will be held from July 1 to July 20; and the final session is set for July 22 to August 10.

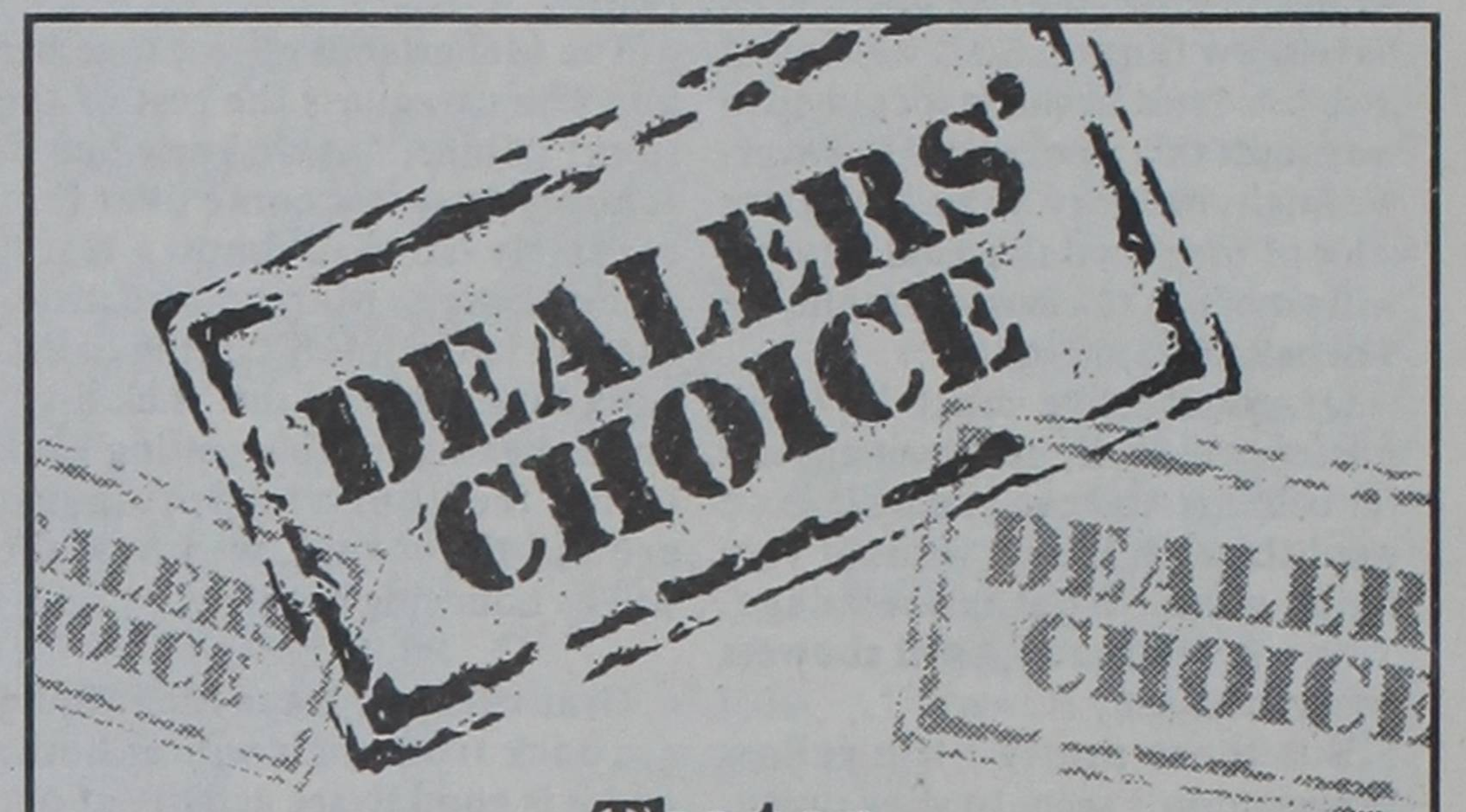

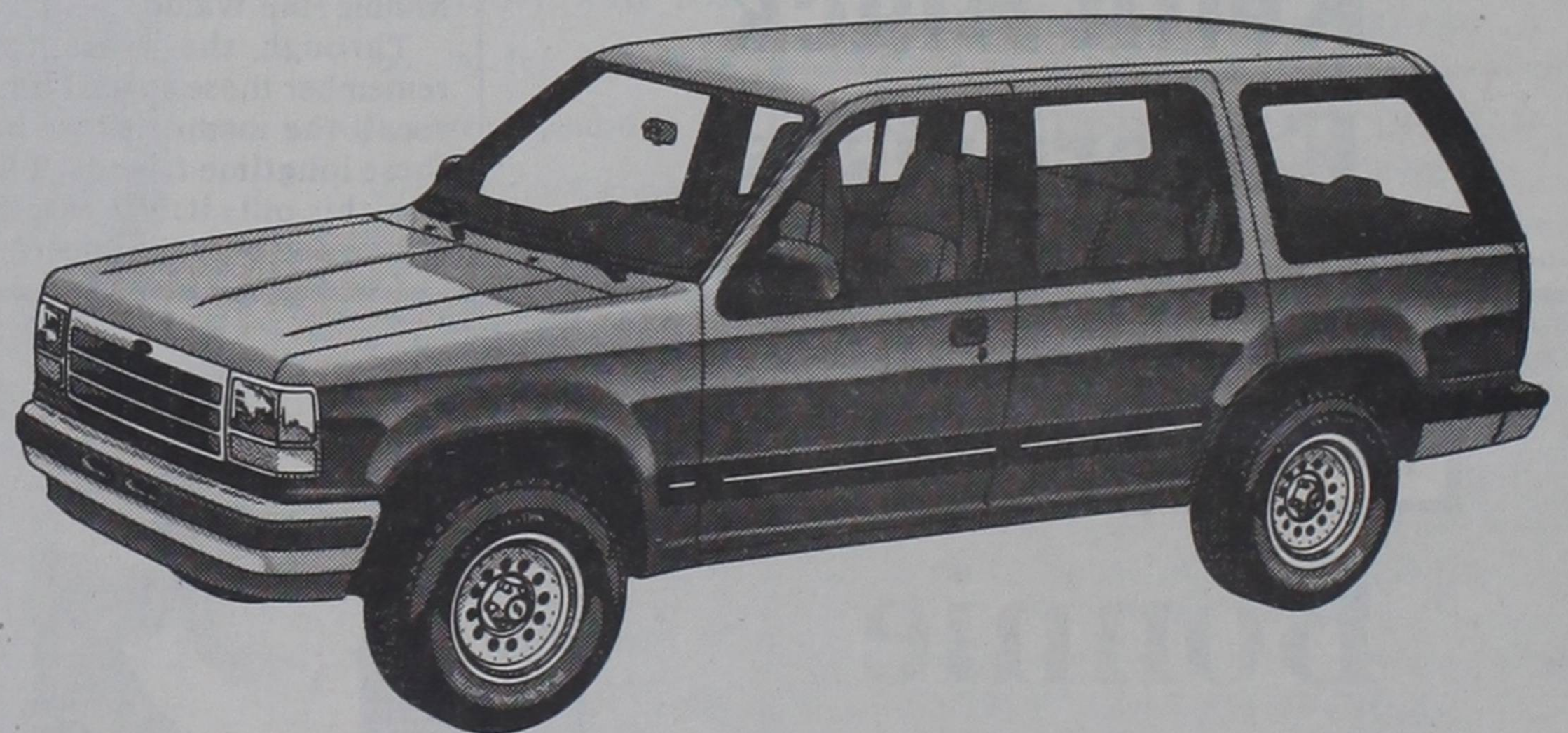

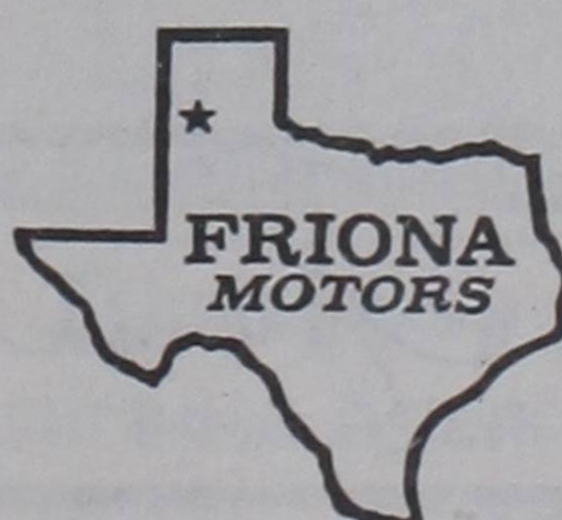

Our sympathy is extended to Dean Hall and Edna Rhodes on the loss of their mother and another long time friend of ours, Minnie Hall Waldo.

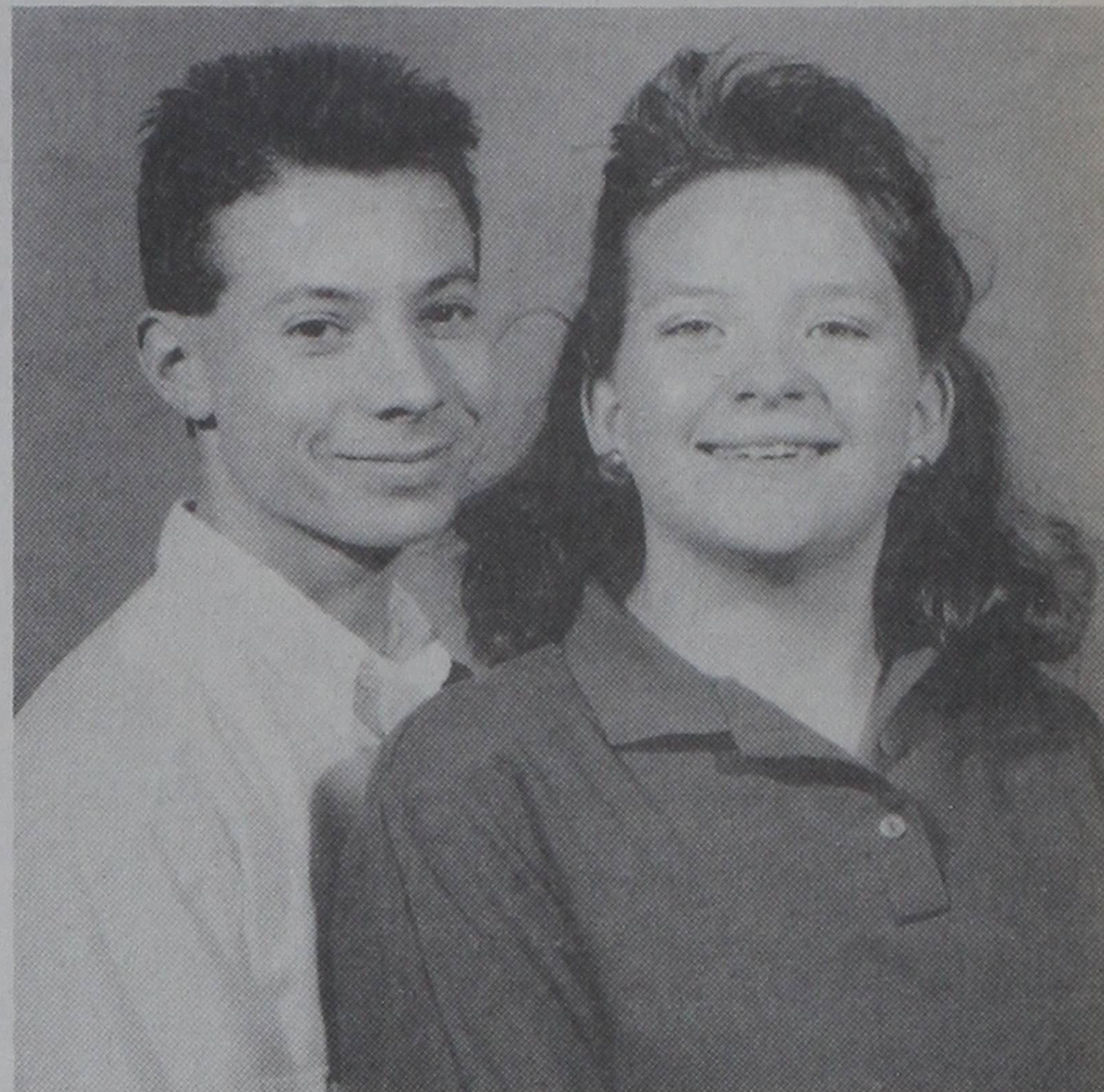
Through the years, we can remember those special times and recall the memories we have of these longtime friends. I like the way this puts it: We emulate the virtues and bury the imperfections.
