Dear Friona:
 Many of you will remember when Bob Clark was diagnosed as having A.L.S. (Lou Gehrig's disease) which causes all voluntary muscles to deteriorate. Bob has been confined to a wheelchair since June, 1988 and has lost the use of his arms. He is no longer able to walk. Just to communicate daily needs such as "I need up," "I have an itch," or "I'm thirsty," is very laborious, frustrating and sometimes impossible.

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After Bob was no longer able to move he still had input in his two young sons' lives such as helping with homework, giving advice and instructions on how to build something or sports skills. Now that he can no longer talk he does not have much input in their lives.

We need your help to buy this equipment. We are applying for funding through several local and national organizations, family and friends. It will cost between \$4,000 and \$5,000. Contributions can be made into a special account at the Friona State Bank to help with this purchase.

Three years ago when we found out that Bob had A.L.S. many of you gave very generously. The money you gave helped defray our travel expenses for Bob to attend a clinic in Houston. At that clinic we were able to meet with a whole team of specialists every month for a year. The help they were able to offer has been very beneficial to us in our struggle against and the management of this disease.

FHS Runs Away With Net Honors

Friona High School ran away with the District 2-AAA tennis tournament honors at Lubbock April 9-10.

Friona High School qualified three individuals and three doubles teams for the regional meet, in claiming nine of the top 12 spots in the tournament.

So well did FHS dominate the event that in the varsity singles, Chieftain netters played each other for the championship, and did the same in varsity boys and JV boys' doubles.

David Barnett won the boys singles title, beating teammate Mark Outland in the finals, 6-0, 6-0.

Barnett scored wins over Jay Gunnels of Tulia and Scott Stahl of Dimmitt enroute to the finals, losing only two games.

Outland had wins over Saul Reyes of Tulia, 6-0, 6-0, and Chad Killingsworth of Dimmitt, 6-1, 6-3.

In boys doubles, the team of Steven Dickson-Arturo Perez, who were second-seeded, downed the FHS second team, Koby Rogers-Nathan Scott, 6-1, 6-3, for the district title.

Dickson-Perez beat Patel-Sims of Dimmitt, 6-1, 6-1, and McDune-Doan of Tulia, 6-1, 6-2, to reach the finals.

Rogers and Scott downed Quintana-Reigel of Muleshoe, 6-4, 6-2, and Bullard-Ross of Tulia, 7-6, 6-4, to gain the finals.

Both FHS doubles teams and the top two singles in boys qualified for the regional meet.

In varsity girls singles, Elaine White battled to the finals, but was edged by Halley Bradley of Dimmitt, 6-2, 6-0. Miss White still earns a spot at regional.

The Friona varsity members will compete in the regional tournament at Odessa April 25-26.

"I was extremely pleased with the way the kids competed in the district meet. We did about as well as we could have possibly hoped to do," said Greg Stockstill, FHS tennis coach.

Bovina finished second with 454. Nazareth finished third with 465. Sudan finished last.

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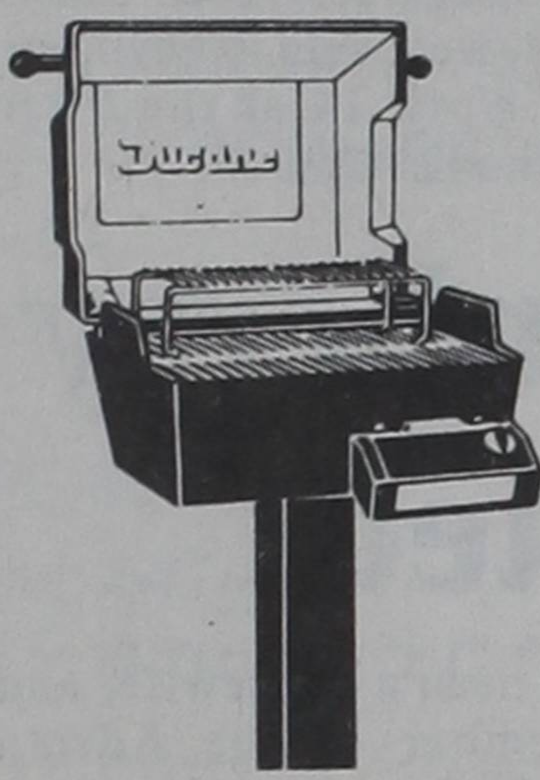
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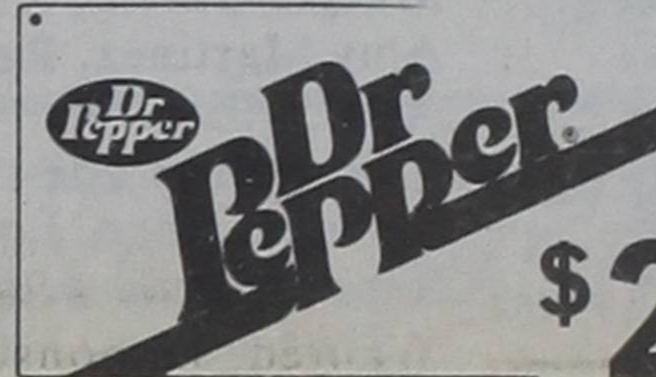
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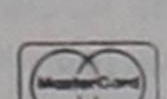

The United States Achievement Academy announced this week that Wade Procter has been named a United States National Award winner in science.

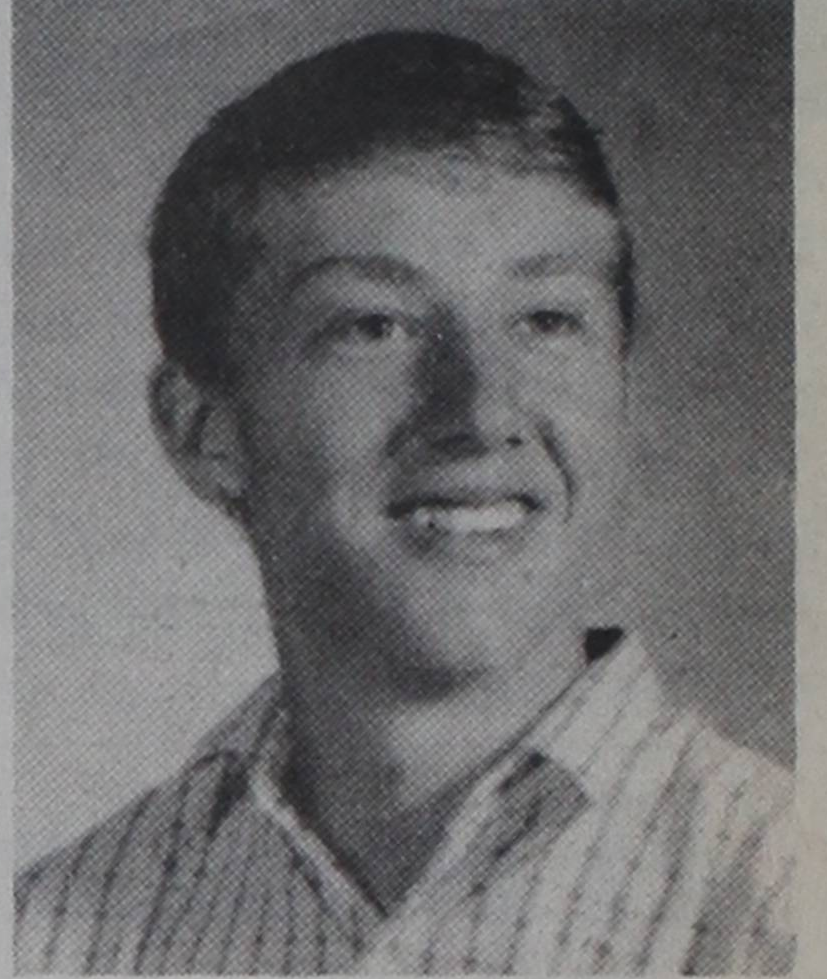
This award is a prestigious honor very few students can ever hope to attain. In fact, the Academy recognizes less than ten per cent of all American high school students.
