From the middle classes, from the smaller trades people, whose existence is already precarlous, and from indirect taxes. $\div$ <br> 1 hear that there is some likellhood of the Chinese Ipperial army bein re-armed, at least in part, with rifles of a modern German type. The stocks of obsolete weapons discarded by the European governments in the past two decades have been gradually absorbed, and the opportunities for inexpensive rearmament tend of necessity to become more restricted every year. An informant connected with this trade tells me that Mausers, Mannlichers, Remingtons, and similar arms are no longer available to any serious extent, and that, even if they were, the tendency of the Chinese war office is to follow the navy precedents by adopting weapons of modern precision, especlally of the types which have repeating mechanism or cartridge clips. <br> There is a pointer here to American gun makers. <br> A newspaper correspondent has succeeded in obtaining an interview with the Abbyssinian Emperor, at which the German minister was also present. The conversation appears to have turned to a great extent on the unfavorable treatment of German residents in Ethopla, but the correspondent was forced to admit that, while misunderstandings and badly translated contract documents have had their share in making Germans unpopular, the latter had also contributed by "fmprudent language which had wounded the pride of natives.'
