# **OODLES O FHOUSES** BUILT THIS YEAR

BRICK FACTORY HAS TURNED OUT ENORMOUS OUTPUT.

In All Fifteen Brick Business Houses Have Been Erected Here Since January 1 Last.

During the last year more building as been done in San Angelo and more structures started than any preceding

Not only have large business houses been erected to the height of several stories, but fine residences have been built that cost far above the thousand

It is estimated that over 5,000,000 brick have already been used in building in San Angelo this year. By the time the year is out the 6,000,000 mark will likely be reached. That is nearly \$75,000 worth of brick. The brick is not one-half of the cost in building. It is almost impossible to estimate the number of feet of lumber that has been used in building residences alone in San Angelo this year. It is an immense amount, however. Several houses that cost from \$10,000 to \$15,-600 have been built. There are some being constructed now that will cost equally as much. . S. Hamilton, for instance, is having one of the finest residences in San Angelo, or Texas, for that matter, constructed.

The San Angelo Brick Manufacturing Company puts out about 150 000 brick per week when things are in good running order. The demand for brick s so great that the vast amount made by the company is used as fast as they can burn them. Besides this number, many brick are shipped in here.

Within the last year about fifteen brick houses have been built in San Angelo. The cost of each house will average about \$12,000. That makes 200,000 worth of houses built in San Angelo, leaving out several that are

Rider, former husband of Mrs. Dora Doxey, whose body was exhumed in Fee Fee cemetery, St. Louis county, Saturday, and in whose vital rgans physicians are searching for races of poison.

Rider's relatives say his wife left St. Louis immediately after his funeral and last week Miss Rider located Mrs. Doxey at Columbus, Neb., where, she says, she was living as the wife of a

Miss Rider caused the woman's arest, on a statutory charge, but she produced a marriage license, showing hat she had wedded Dr. Doxey years

She declared she did not marry lider, but only acted as his nurse, As his wife, however, she collected \$500. insurance on a sister of Rider who had named him as beneficiary.,

A sensational development of the Doxey case was the arrest at Colum bus of Dr. Doxey himself, on th charge preferred by the county attorney that he had been administering morphine and other poisons to his wife with intent to kill her. Ever since her arrest Mrs. Doxey has been closely confined to their rooms, and the doctor announced that she was suffering from a nervous shock, occasioned by the cruel character of the charges made against her.

Dr. Doxey vigorously protested his innocence and averred that he was but giving her what medicine was necessary for her condition. The state was without any evidence to ambarantiate its charge save the condition of the woman and after wrangling over the matter for several bours. Doxey was released upon his agreement that he would turn his wife over to the ministrations of some other doctor and that he himself would give her no more medicine at all.


