Managua, Nicaragua, Dec 20 .- Dr. Jose Madriz, judge of the Central American court of justice at Cartage, was today elected president of Nicarigua in place of Zelaya. This election was made by congress at the demand of Zelaya, despite the protests of General Estrada, the United States and the people of Nicaragua.

This leaves the Nicaraguan tangle in a worse tangle than ever.

The session of the Nicaraguan congress was a stormy one. When the election was finally announced, deputies in sympathy with Zelaya cheered and shouted, "Long live Madriz.

Dr. Madriz will assume the presidency at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning, amide great pomp. He was escorted to his hotel tonight by Zelaya's loyal troops and made a speech from the balcony.

Madriz in an interview tonight asked the people to unite and help create harmony throughout the na-

The rebels are making ready for more fighting because the people will never submit to Madriz. They say he is a tool of Zelaya.

Estrada Appeals to Knox. Publishers Press.

Washington, Dec. 20.-General Estrada of the revolutionary army in Nicaragua appealed to Knox today in a cablegram. Estrada says peace can only be established and maintained in Nicaragua by the complete expulsion of Zelaya and his followers.






