You can readily see that money was lost by the farmers on every dollar's worth they bought. As it seems to me that the mail order business has become a debateable question, and while 1 am not in anywise a debater but wish to expreas myself $t$ the patrons and readers of the Messenger as to the mail order houses of the world.
I am a reader of the Messen ger and at one time a citizen of Grapeland and I have done business with many different merchants of our country, and I find that merchants as a rule are at all times ready to do the right thing towards their loyal patrons. I say the mail order patrons have not been abused as the brother from Oak Groye stated, but do say the mail order houses and their patrons should be abused to a certain extent.
I fully consur with the Messen ger; it is so inconsistent for us to send our means away from home for goods we never saw, and often never see.

What would be the result? We may and we should pay for them, for if our merchants are Avil doers we should go according to the scriptures, retarn good for evil that sticks to user to them there is exceptions to all rules and when a citizen of our coantry is denied of accomadation, you may know he has not been loyal to his fellowman. As to the prices we pay at home. Is it suposed that our merchants can set up in business, pay freight on goods, pay draymen and clerk hire and sell goods at these condemned mail order house prices?
