| Of course, in as much as the new law equalizes rates and requires every citizen to pay the same rate on the same character of risk it abolished all rebates which had theretofore been given, and necessarily raised the rates of those who had been getting the re- bates. These rebates had been going almost exclusively to the larger insurers and when their rates were increased they immediately asserted that all rates had been increased. But as the results show that the companies collected on an average seven cents less for each one hundred dollars fire insurance written in the state than they did he year before, it is conclusively established that the rates which were increased were more than equaled by those that were decreased. the net result being to reduce the average <br> The department records show that during 1911, the second year under the policy of state regulation, the people of Texas bought fire insurance policies aggregating $\$ 669,148,653$ in amount, for which they paid premiums aggregating the sum of $\$ 9.153$,979. or thof same average rate as the preceding year 1910, $\$ 1.37$ for each |  |
