Legally Blind medical one. It does not mean that the individual cannot see at all or take care of personal needs. Rather, it generally refers to someone whose vision cannot be cor-
rected effectively to better than $20 / 200$. rected effectively to better than 20/200. Once certified legally blind, and usually the optometrist provides
the certification, the patient is entitled to state and/or federal assistance to pay for vision services to make the most of the vision remaining.
There's a wide variety of low-vision aids designed to enhance remaining vision, most often utilizing magnification. They range
from simple hand-held magnifiers to telescopic lenses or from simple hand-held magnifiers to telescopic lenses or
microscopic segments for regular lenses. There are even computertype programs to display extra-large letters. For the patient with severely restricted eyesight, an
optometrist will not only prescribe and provide helpful devices but also will help the legally blind person adjust to them.
