eye. He is so accustomed to deal
ing in big figures and purchasing and selling large numbers of cattle that
a little thing like a wad of greenbacks doesn' interest him. Lack of
age is no handigap for him, as he was
born and reafed on the range and nows more about the cattle business
than many men much older.
Marcus Snyder is 26 years old, and manager of the big cattle ranch
of Zea, Stonebraker and Syyder, at
Colorado City; a product of Texas, is one of the biggest shrewdest and
wealthiest cowmen in West Texas,
and is the youngest successful cat tlemen in the entire state, according
to cattle brokers here. Born on a
cow ranch, reared on a horse, more
