The noted minister and founder of Temple University believes Thomas A. Edison's efforts to invent an instrument to determine the existence

of spirits is a feasible undertaking. "I sincerely believe," said Dr. Conwell. "that the day will come when an instrument will be invented to record communications from the spirit world. The invention of wireless telegraphy has been a step in that direction."

Although Dr. Conwell is of the opinion that radio-telegraphy is only a crude beginning from which to work out the perfection of instruments which will be sensitive to the reception of spirit messages, he is not certain that Thomas A. Edison has not already discovered the method with which to establish communications with the spirit world.

Following is the call:

To Cotton Growers and all Others Holding Low Grade Cotton:

We, the undersigned cotton growers of Texas, hereby call a mass meeting of all citizens of this state who are now holding low grade cotton, to meet in Waco, Texas, on Tuesday, November 16th, at 10 a. m., at the offices of the Chamber of Commerce, for the purpose of considering the advisability and practicability of pooling all law grade cotton in this state for shipment and sale to European countries.

In view of the fact that low grade cotton has been accumulating during and since the great war, it is absolutely necessary that some effective measures be adopted at once to dispose of this low grade cotton before next year's crop is put on the market. After a careful investigation and conferences with leading farmers and cotton growers of this state, it is deemed wise and proper that the best course to pursue is the one outlined above.

An investigation shows that Germany alone today needs two million bales of cotton; Bohemia needs half a million bales, and other European countries today are idle for lack of

The time is too short to rely upon any export corporation yet to be organized to handle the enormous quantity of low grade cotton now on hand in this country.

We urge the citizens of every county and community who are holds ing low grade cotton to attend this meeting or send representatives

The government having taken the railroads and used them for its own purposes for 26 months, did, after it got through with them and returned them to their owners, guarantee earnings for half a year, to allow time for investigation of rates; but that period expired the last of August. The railroads now depend wholly on what they can earn on the rates fixed by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

The Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce made public this week the preliminary figures of the country's foreign trade for the month of September. The value of the imports shows a very sharp falling off. The real surprise in the figures lies in the fact that exports record a material increase in value. Our imports of merchandise for the month of September amounted only to \$363,-000,000, as compared with \$513,-000,000 in August this year and with \$435,000,000 in September, 1919. On the other hand, the value of our exports for September, 1920 was \$606,000,000 against \$578,000,000 in August, 1920, and \$595,000,000 in September, 1919. Accordingly the balance of trade in favor of the United States after steadily diminishing for some months past took a violent upward jump in September, amounting to no less than \$243,000,-000, as compared with only \$65,-000,000 in August this year and \$160,000,000 in September, 1919.





And while the State is loud in its outcry and alarm, what are the rightful heirs of the State, the Americans themselves, doing about it, beyond listening to hectic, speeches, reading alarmist articles and expressing their horrified concern? Are seeing to it that their birth rate shows the proper and desirable increase in free-born American citizens to carry great Nation? Or are they shirking their own responsibilities, selfishly considering their own immediate comfort and depending upon foreign im-

The statistics are painfully illuhearts we well know that we are damning the Japanese for the very virtue which is most essential to the welfare of the country at large and California in particular. When an American family has two children the Janaese bave at least half a dozen. But more often the American couple has but one, or none at all.

But whatever the causes, the fact remains that the American citizen is not doing his duty to the State and the Nation. The blame can not be put wholly upon the wives, whose cowardice and selfishness are often aided and abetted by their husbands, for well we know that both sexes are equally capable in this vital department of public

It makes a good election cry, this Japanese invasion, and no one wants to see California become a Japanese colony. And while a certain amount of legislation may meet the case in part, the vital need of Californians is to beat the Japanese at their own game. We have seen the amazing and effectual result of persistent industry on the one hand and of a healthy, prolific birth rate on the other. These "criminal" virtues are responsible for the rapid rise of the Japanese in California and without they they could never have become an international issue, never have given us a moment's concern. Which might have been more comfortable for ourselves, but would most effectually have stultified Japanese progress and Japanese influence, just as it must stultify our own. So long as we are content to de-

pend upon foreign immigration for our census gains, so long as Ameri cans deny the right of existence to blood, this country must be up against future American citizens of our own "foreign meance" much more subtle and alarming than actual military invasion. So long, moreover, as well are willing that "indefatigable industry" shoud be the exclusive virtue of the invaders, while our own workers continue to strike for shorter hours and higher pay, just so much are we Had our forefathers shirked their duties in application and industry, in child-bearing and responsibility the United States could never have risen to the proud place she holds in the world today.
