## CLEAN UP PROCLAMATION

The City Council, at its last regular meeting, ordered a genral clean-up to take place on Tuesday, the 20th day of March which will be Tuesday of next week. This order was passed in obedience to the request of the State Health Officer, who has re quested every town and city in the State to have a thorough cleaning. Dr. W. H. Beazley, State Health Officer, is launching a clean-up campaign for the whole State, and he estimates that by so doing 20,000 lives can be saved in the State, by preventing disease and by destruction of flies and disease germs.

The City of Pecos needs a thorough cleaning, not only with a view of preventing disease, but also with a view of preventing fires.
We are having bad sand storms and it is highly important that all trash piles and other combustible materials scattered around in the City be cleaned up and hauled out of town. This will go a long way towards preventing both disease and fire. We cannot afford to have another disastrous fire, and every means within $\frac{1}{c}$

It is therefore highly important that every citizen of the town should clean his own premises of trash and filth of every kind and pile all of the trash out in the alleys where it can be gotten out by trucks and wagons which the city will have employed to haul off to the dump pile outside of the city where it can be burned.

The State Health Officer in directing this great clean-up is do ing a duty which will save many lives in the State and preven much suffering and misery. And every citizen owes to himself, his neighbors, the town and the State, the duty of complying with the request of the State Health Officer, and by so doing, you will
be benefiting not only yourself, but thousands of others be benefiting not only yourself, but thousands of others, It is also
