South is threatened by this menace. The following report from a committee of entomoligists gives sme comprehension of the possible damage to the cotton crop should icate the pest:

"This pest was first discovered in Egypt in 1843. Since then it has been transported to practically all the important cotton growing regions of the word, through the imprtation of Egyptian cotton seed. It was introduced into Mexico about 1911, where it caused a minimum annual loss of at least twenty per cent of the entire crop, according to authentic statistics gathered by the United States Department of Agriculture. In Hawaii it destroys from fifty to ninety per cent of the crop and the raising of cotton has been practically abandoned.

IN THIS SECTION "The recent development in the Toyah-Pecos field has more significance than the mere fact that it will add to the supply of crude oil now rapidly nearing a shortage of demand," said J. H. Ritchie, geologist. "The fact that there is a pool of high grade oil in this section of the state is of the greatest importance, as it indicates the possibility of an oil field in this section of

EXPERT SAYS OIL

great extent. "While it is probable that the oil found in the Toyah-Pecos district is migratory oil, as oil is not a product of Permian sediments, yet it still indicates a large body of oil as the source. Undoubtedly the Permian formation is underlaid by the Pennsylvania throughout a big part of he Trans-Pecos region, and his embraces an extensive area.

Exposed Pennsylvanian "This is evidenced by the presence of this formation being exposed in he Hueco and Eagle Flat basins, and also in the Baylor and Sierra Diablo Mountains.

"The probable source of the oil in the Bell well is the underlaying Pennsylvanian that through faulting has brought the Periam in contact with the oil bearing Pennsylvanian, or it may have traveled much farther, perhaps having its ource in the Hueco or Tularosa basin; and moving down the eastern slope of the plains, has permeated the Periam. However, I believe it more probable that the real source is in the adjacent Pennsylvanian formations, most likely to the west or south.

The Marathon Field "While El Paso is taking a commendable interest in this new field, it will be well for it to keep watch n another section of El Paso territory. I have reference to the extensive deveopment now going on and projected in Brewster County. In this county the Pennsylvania formation is exposed over a very extensive area, and it is so highly carboniferous that great possibilities may be fairly predicted as regards will production. The fact that this formation in this county is probably thicker than in any other part of the state is very probably another large factor in its favor There are at this time four wells drilling near Marathon and several more rigs going up, while a nummade
