## Fiery physician in the state

 Texas shall report in writing or by an acknowledyed telephone rommuits: immedately after his or her frot profosonal visit, each patient he or she shall have or suspect susfering w th any contageous disease and if such disease is of pestilential nature he shall notify the President of the State Board of Health at Austin by telegraph or telephone at Stae's expense, and he or sheshall report to the said health anthority every death from such disease immediately after it shallhave occurred. The atfending physician is authorized and it is made his duty to place the patient under the restrictions of character described herein below in the case of each and every respective disease.
Physicians, Surgeons.
and Parents shall report births. All physicians. surgeons or accouchers ruth of a child or in the abern of such attendance. either parent of the child, shall report the fact to gether with all statistical data relating thereto, within five days from time of birth to the city or county regstrar as hereinafter provided for
