BIG 4th OF JULY CELEBRATION

It was estimated that fully seventy five per cent of Marfa's population went to Valentine to join in celebrating the birth of our Nation, and everybody had a word of praise for the way the citizens of Valentine pulled off this big event.

Everything was free—the delicious barbecue and chuck wagon meals were served in abundance to all. The rodeo entertainment, the base ball games and the final wind-up with a dance, at which Mabel Moody's jazz band of El Paso, rendered some of the liveliest music ever played in that hustling little city.

Every citizen of Valentine saw to it that the visitors were well cared for and the private homes were open to them free of expense.

Ideal weather added to the pleasure of this celebration, as well as the program of amusements.

The base ball game between Valentine and Sierra Blanc was indeed a very interesting one and the final finish gave the victory to the Valentine team.

The goat roping was also very interesting, for some of West Texas' most noted cowboys participated in this part of the program.

The barbecue that was served in abundance to all, was about the best ever prepared on such an occasion, and much comment was heard how juicy and tender the meat was.

The hospitality of the Valentine citizens was greatly appreciated by all who attended and we can vouch for the fact that everybody from Marfa had the time of their lives, and the day will long be remembered.

MUSICAL CLUB ORGANIZED

Last Monday, July 3rd, a number of young people met at the home of Miss Nell Wilson and organized a National Federation Musical Club.

It is the intention to build up a membership of twenty and to meet in regular session every first and third Tuesday in each month. The meeting hour to be 7:30 p. m.

Those who met with Miss Wilson and organized this club feel very enthusiastic, for there has never been such an organization attempted in Marfa heretofore and they all feel like it will be a big success.

BIG CELEBRATION AT DAVIS

On Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week the quiet little city of Fort Davis, which is tucked away in the bosom of the Davis mountains, 21 miles north of Marfa, was the scene of one of the liveliest times in the history of that city.

It was a celebration long to be remembered by all who attended and was given in honor of the Old Spanish Trail convention, which convened in that city on the 6th, 7th and 8th.

The caravan that arrived at Fort Davis consisted of only eight cars, crowded with delegates to the convention, although twenty-two filled cars had left San Antonio to make the trip, many of them had to turn back on account of all sorts of trouble, mostly bad weather, while some of them experienced car trouble.

In addition to the eight cars of east Texas delegates there were several hundred delegates and persons interested in the Old Spanish Trail convention in attendance from adjoining towns and counties. Hundreds of visitors were there from Valentine, Alpine, Marfa, Fort Stockton, Pecos, Marathon, Balmorhea and Sierra Blanca, who participated in this celebration.

The convention proper was held up

in Limpia Canyon, about eight miles west of Fort Davis in a beautiful spot, covered with oak trees, on the A. G. Prude ranch.

The camp site was all cleared up and put in splendid shape by a committee of Fort Davis citizens, and they even had electric lights strung from tree to tree for the comforts of the visitors. This electric illumination was furnished free of charge by W. E. Caldwell, of Alpine, Texas, who is agent for the Kohler Automatic Power and Light System. He had the engine installed on a truck and equipped with an automatic starter; the only thing necessary to start the engine was to turn a globe in any part of the camp ground and like a flash of lightning, the engine would start and the light would burn.

A fine barbecue and camp meals were served to all present and several addresses by leading citizens were enjoyed. Among those who spoke were Lon A. Smith, State Comptroller of Austin, Texas; Dr. J. C. Hardy, president of Baylor College, Belton, Texas; J. D. Jackson, Alpine, Texas; Judge W. W. Bogel, of Marfa, Texas, and others.

In addition to the convention, a big Rodeo exhibition was staged every day for the benefit of the visitors and some good records were made by the cowboys of this section of the state.

One of the leading features discussed at the convention was the establishment of a State Park in the Davis mountains, and many of the speakers dwelt very strongly on this subject and their remarks were applauded with much enthusiasm.

For each day's celebration there was a well arranged program so

that everyone could attend that which interested him the most and every night a dance was given in the court house, with splendid music rendered by the Mabel Moody orchestra of El Paso.

The Fort Davis people took a great deal of pains to see that each and every visitor was cared for and everybody was made to feel at home.

The whole celebration was one of the best ever pulled off in this section of the state and every person in attendance had a word of praise for the way the Fort Davis people treated their guests.

Tragedy in Mexican Town

(From the Alpine Avalanche)
Eusebio Ramirez is dead and Galixto Cobos is in jail facing a charge of murder. As near as can be learned by inquiry the facts are as follows:

Tuesday night the Mexicans of Alpine were enjoying a dance. Ramirez was one of the musicians. About 10 o'clock he left the orchestra, for what purpose is not known. It appears he went directly to the home of Cobos. Mrs. Cobos had just put out the lights and prepared to retire. Ramirez entered through the kitchen door when Mrs. Cobos discovered him; it was at this point Cobos came by the front door with one J. Manta. Ramirez saw the husband coming and started to run away but Cobos pursued him and caught him within the block and forced him to return to the house where, after locking the door, he had Ramirez sit down and asked him to explain why he, Ramirez, was in his, Cobos' house

at that hour of the night. Ramirez asked his captor to not get excited and he would explain everything, but Cobos appears to have lost his head and going into the kitchen returned with a big hammer and rushing on Ramirez, struck him on the head a terrific blow and followed this up with terrific blows, crushing the skull.

When she saw what was happening Mrs. Cobos rushed from the house and disappeared. Cobos started out to search for her, meanwhile Rev. S. M. Giran was notified of the tragedy, as Cobos, it was believed, would have committed more crime had he found his wife. The priest, with the assistance of Jesus Cobos, father of the murderer, succeeded in disarming him, and after getting him quieted down, the priest advised him to surrender to the authorities and in company with priest and his father, Cobos went to the court house and gave himself up.

The murdered man was about 27 years old and leaves a wife and three little children. Cobos is about 21 years of age.

A number of people immediately lent their assistance, among them we wish to mention: George H. Walker, proprietor of the Art Shop Photographic Studio, who sent the family a big bill of groceries, comprising everything needed for a month's supply.

Some permanent arrangement should be perfected by which this sick man receive proper medical attention and his family cared for. We understand he was employed on the road, work at the time of his injuries.

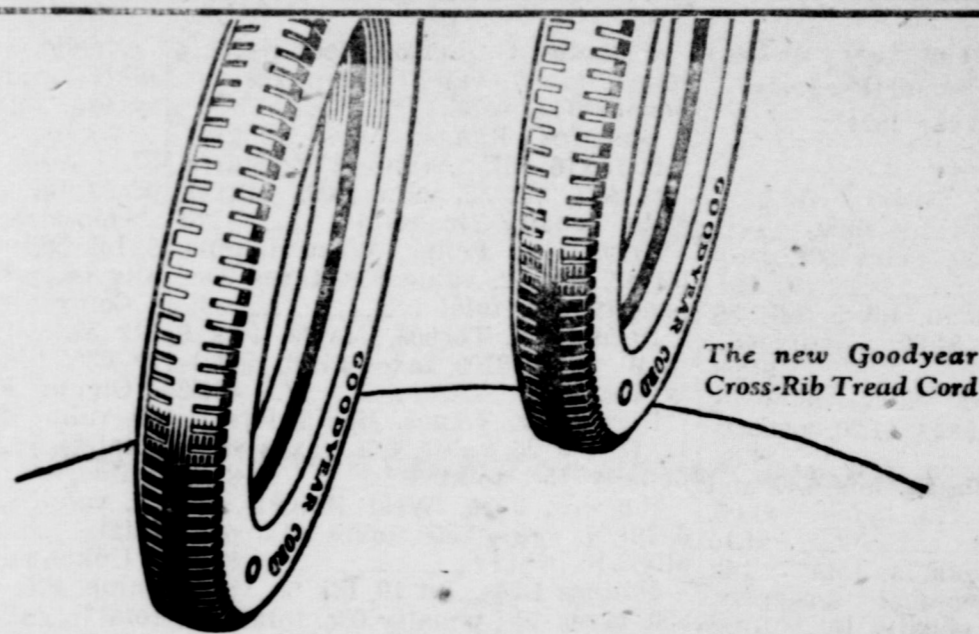
