## Suspicions About Wall Street

## and How. They Arise

pLD-BE economists, political orators and the genera pion make frequent positive assertions about the func Wall Street or what purpose it serves. Lack of knowledge breeds suspicion. Yet it is not difficult to understand the nature and function of Wall Street. Let us set down a few of the facts which account for the existence and nation-wide, as well as international, services of W all Street.

There are 316 banks in New York with combined capital and surplus of about $\$ 1,400$, 000,000 . Their deposits aggregate over $\$ 11$, $500,000,000$, and during 1924 their total volume
F. H. sisson The New York Stock Exchange in 1925 sold $463,000,000$ shares of stock and in $1924 \$ 3,828,000,000$ worth of $b$ nds. Wall Street is the national credit and money market It is just as essential that there be markets for money and for stocks, bonds, mortgages and other securities as for cotton, corn, tobacco, Wheat, hogs and other commodities.

If Wall Street Were Destroyed
Wall Street is the natural evolution of the forces of trade and finance. It exists because there is imperative need for it in the nation's business. If some cataclysm should destroy the financial district of New York we would see frantic efforts to re-estab lish it so that trade and industry could continue. If the production and marketing of agricultural and indus trial commodities did not need such a financial institution, Wall Street would not exist.
We depend upon the farmer to help maintain the general level of pros perity. Wall Street as a money mar ket is called upon to finance the krowth and marketing of farm crops Many Wall Street bankers were born and raised on farms. If they were not thoroughly famillar with agricultural requirements, they could not financial world
In the period of deflation, Wall Street suffered proportionately as much as the farmer. The aggregate losses of Wall Street banks mounted to a staggering sum. Wall Street is not an independent institution, but an organic part of the country's business system, necessarily reflecting the ups and downs of business.

Four Billion Dollar
An approximate estimate of the maln items in Wall Street's financial operations in handHng farm crops shows that New York banks for the purpose of agriculture put out com mercial loans to the value of one bil ILon dollars, hold bankers' acceptances for another bilion, buy commercia paper such as cattje and sheep loan or a third billion and carry balance of country banks for a fourth billion. Thus Wall Street furnishes a $\$ 4,000$ 000,000 river of credit annually to pro duce farm products and foat them to market.
The outward fow to rurel bank nables them to mate the reguired advances on farm crops and for ware housing and handling cotton, tobacco, wheat, raisins, prunes and countiess ther products. Onteide of his oern personal efforts on his farm Wall Street fa the bigrest single factor in the prosperity of the farmer. After these commodities have been moved to market, the money used in handin them returns to Wall Street for in restment. New York is the largest security market in the country and offers a me market for the idl capital of the rural banke between capita.

ry fows from every part of the coun ry to New York, attracted by the reater opportunity for their profitable accumulations of depoelts are hrge, and in turn the openings for the extul emplogmest of these funde in
the facilitation of trade, industry and investment are upon a correspond ingly ample scale. it is clear that these funds must be employed sanely, constructively and to the real servic of the business community. Other wise they would inevitably soon be withdrawn.
Huge Investments Help Farmers
These huge investment operations in Wall Street are of significance to th farmer. Much of the $\$ 10,000,000,00$ invested in farm mortgages was ad vanced by Eastern financial institutions. In no sense is Wall Street' interest in agriculture local or sec tional. The main function of Ne York financial institutions is to sen money where it is most needed.
Another service rendered to agricu ture by Wall Street is the purchas of Farm Loan bonds, Joint Stock Land Bank bonds and the debenture of the Intermediate Credit Banks. There is a total of $\$ 1,451,800,000$ of this paper outstanding, of which New York banks took about one billion. Wall Street loans to country bank are made at low rates, usually below $41 / 2$ per cent. The local banker' rates to his customers are adjusted to local conditions, which cannot justly be laid at the door of Wall Street General financial service to othe ndustries related to agriculture als helps the farmer substantially. Wa Street loans to the packers, railroads millers and farm-machinery manufac urers to help them serve agriculture Wall Street is as necessary and serviceable in the handling of credit and capital as is the cold-storage plan in caring for seasonal perishable prod ucts. The necessity of such a credit center in a country with a $\$ 60,000$ 000.000 annual business is obvions
