WATER WORKS AND SEWERS

The City Commission of Marfa have called an election for \$114,000. 00 bonds for the purpose of financing the construction of Water Works and a Sewer System for City.

Surveys and plans have been made. The Engineers, guaranteed es timate ofcost shows that both thes improvements can by secure ot a reasonable price. The Marth New Era will publish a series of ar fides describing these improvements, Citizens will do well to study these, as well as to preserve and -read the printed descriptions which will be mailed later.

The City Commission intends to put this project before the voters in such a manner thet each one will be able to determine from facts whether or not the project is worthy of their support.

This would be a good investment for private capital it is equally good as a city wide in vestment. If no arguments were offered there is no excuse or justifiable reason for a single vote in opposition to the water bond issue.

But there is another and greater reason for this forward step. The people generally do not fully appreciate the dangers of shallow wells, and the possibility of their contamination. Next to air, water is general ly conceded to be the most important factor in sustaining life.

It is found by experience that very few water supplies are satisfactory for drinking purposes. It has ben said that impure water has taken a larger toll of life than all the wars the world has ever known. 



NOTICE OF INTRODUCTION OF VALIDATING ACT.

Notice is hereby given to all property owners and all interested parties that at the First Called Session of the Thirty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Texas, to be convened in the city of Austin, Texas, on the 13 day of September, A. D. 1926, there will be introduced a bill in respect to Road District No. 1 of Jeff Davis County, Texas, and the substance of such proposed law is as follows:

An act to create Road District No. 1 in Jeff Lavis County, Texas; validating and approving all orders made by the Commissioners Court of said County in respect to the organization of said District; Validating the Authorization, Issuance, and sale of certain road bonds thereof, and providing for their payment by the Annual Levy, Assessment and collection of General Ad Valorem Taxes on all Taxable property in aid Road District; approving and validating all orders of the Commisioners Court of said County in respect of said Road District, Bonds and Taxes, or certified copies there of, and constituting such orders legal evidence, and declaring an Emergency.





VOUTH pays the heaviest toll in annual automobile fatalities. From five to fifteen years is the period when the greatest number of fatal accidents occur, for both sexes. The chart shows the age distribution of automobile deaths for men and women as given in the latest mortality figures prepared by the government. These figures, says the Stewart-Warner Safety Council for the prevention of automobile accidents, emphasize the need for more playgrounds and increased safety education among school children.

Complete statistics are not possible, as only 85 per cent of the United States keeps mortality records. About 22,000 a year is generally conceded to be the annual number of automobile fatalities. For 8,621 males known to have been killed in one year there were only a third as many women, or 2,845, it. spite of the fact that the male population is only 4 per cent greater than the female.

This chart does not take into consideration the 660,000 Americans who are injured annually by automobiles. Such figures are not available except in
