According to NHTSA, pickup truck drivers and passengers, particularly young males, consistently have the lowest safety belt usage rates of ill motorists. Safety belt use reduces the risk of dying in pickup rollove crashes by up to 80 percent. Others who are less likely to buckle up are ural drivers and drivers who are on the road at night.

Another nationwide effort designed to reduce fatalities is the A.R.E. - Combined Accident Reduction Effort - program. State police officers across the nation participate in C.A.R.E., maximizing enforcement on major interstate highways to reduce fatalities comonly associated with holiday weekends.
