| North German Lleyd Company Pald <br>  <br> In these days when the high cost of living is so much in the public mind, when the bills of the butcher, the grocer and the coal man threaten to disrupt the family happiness and bring the sheriff knocking at the door, it is tnteresting to know what it costs a steamship company to provide food fer passengers who cross and recross the Atlantic. The annual statement of the North German Lloyd for 1912, just issued, gives some interesting facts on the subject. <br> Last year the company's bill for provisions alone was $\$ 4.920,000$, while in the same period the coal man was paid $\mathbf{3 7 , 3 7 6 , 7 3 5}$ for $1,758,740$ tons of coal. For these two items alone the company paid $\$ 12,296,735$. <br> That seasickness does not always interfere with the appetite of ocean travelers is shown by this expenditure of almost 5 million dollars for provisions. The butcher, as usual, reaped the greatest harvest in the matter of provisions, his bill to the North German Lloyd for the year having been $\$ 1,685,000$. This does not include fish and game. For the former the company pald an additional $\$ 239,660$, while the bill for game amounted to s412,360 , a total of $\$ 652,020$. <br> In our household expenditures we are not likely to pay much attention to the cost of preserves, and yet the North German Lloyd spent $\$ 255,760$ |

They were Kansas men-merchants, lawyers, doctors, editors, clerks, mechanics, bankers, farmers. From time to time they stopped at thirteen towns during the day's run. <br> No one in the crowd spoke of beer. No one had any beer. No one at the thirteen towns offered anyone any beer. At most of the towns there were great, deep, stone jars of iced lemonade on the sidewalks with bright tin cups hanging from the jars, and a sign up, "Welcome Emporians." There was no whiskey, beer or wine in the crowd. <br> No: ane [ipissed it. No one spoke of it. For these men, ranging from 30 to 60, had lived in Kansas thirty years under absolute prohibition. Most of them had never been in a saloon in their home town in their lives. Booze was as remote from their consciousness as carbolic acid. Booze is not in the Kansas scheme of things. No one thinks of it: Its presence or absence is not considered by the Kansas mind. -William Allen White, in the Emporia Gazette. <br> ENTIRE TOWN VISITS <br> MAJESTIC IN 90 DAYS. <br> "Six hundred people is perhaps the largest crowd wẹ have had any one night."
