Thank the terrorists. Passports are $\$ 97$ but ar good for 10 -years for persons 6 -years and over. Passports fo people under 16 -years are goodfor 5 -years. It takes a few weeks get one so if you are going o get one so if you are going
o Mexico, the Bahamas or on a cruise or elsewhere next year, now is a good time to get started on passport paperwork. Start with passport photos Walgreen's or Wal-Mart or Sears in Clovis can take them for you.
They have to be official passport photos, not just routine photographs. Passport photos are on a special paper that can withstand the heat applied to seal your photo into the passport. They will take them whil os but only need two for the passport office.
After your get your passport back, go to the copy machine and make a copy of the

court for permission to bury the bones, the commissioners were sympathetic to the cause and not only donated one burial site but also nine more in the county-owned cemetery just in case other Indian bones are uncovered.
