Function and Value of Feedstuff. By DR. R. F. HARE, County Farm Demonstrator.

| feeds, and their uses in the animal body. What I will have to say, then, is addressed more particularly to oughly familiar with the theory of animal feeding. At the same time, it is hoped that it may suggest a few lines of thought to those who are. <br> Before the principles of feeding were underatood the thoughtful feeder realized that certain feeding stuffs failed to furnish those essential constituents necessary to produce the best results at a minimum of expense. A study of the composition of plants, which are the ultimate basis of all animal life, has shown them to be made up of certain groups of substances that serve quite different functions when taken into the animal body as food. To determine the value of these different groups as foods it is sufficient to classify these into four groups, according to the function which they serve in the animal's body. These are water, mineral matter, nitrogenous substances, and corbohydrates and related bodies. These groups are found in different amounts in different plants, and that these are built up in the animal from the corresponding groups in the plant used by them as food. Upon this fact is built the framework of the modern science of feeding. A knowledge of the composition of the animals, and that of the plants upon which they feed, enables us to supply these plants to the animal in the proportion required to produce the desired result. <br> With this principle before us, it would seem that the feeding of any animal for a specific purpose would be a comparatively simple one. We find, however, that the economic feeding often involves many difficult problems. the animal the nutrients in the proportion in which he desires them to be produced in its body, an dto furnish them at the least expense. All feeders when possible should grow their own feed, an dit is often difficult to determine what crops can be most economically grown to produce the largest food value. Analysis shows that there are few plants that contain these nutrients in the proper proportion, which usually means the growing, or at least the feeding, of more than one kind of plant. | Chemical Elements Composing the Nutrients. <br> All forms of matter in the universe are composed of about 70 to 80 sim plest forms, Lat these exist in an infinite variety of combinations to form different and distinct compounds. It has beel found that not over 14 of these simple forms of matter enter as essential constituents into the life of plants and animals. Four of these elements constitute by far the major part of the framework of the plant, and all but the bones of the animals. These are carbon, hydrogen, oxygen, and nitrogen. The other elements are present in small amounts and are represented by the residue of ash after burning. <br> Water, the first of the four groups of substances mentioned above, is present in all plants and animals. Some plants may contain more than 90 per cent, and most animals contain over half of their weight of water. This group is not considered as one of the nutrients. While it is essential to the life of an animal, and adds to the succulence, and perhaps the digestibility, the amount present lessens the amount of other nutrients possible in a given weight. <br> The mineral matter is used by the animal to build bones, and in small amounts for stimulating digestion. This group of plant bodies are also not included as nutrients for the animal, and excessive amounts detract from the value of the food. There are few if any feeds that fail to contain sufficient ash to furnish animals with the required amount, and common salt is about the only additional one needed, unless the animal is confined on an exciusive grain ration. In this event the mineral matter may be supplied by ashes of plants or bones. <br> The two last-named groups of substances found in plants are the true nutrients in feeds, the amount and for feeding purposes. These are the two groups that furnish the feeder with a basis for the calculation of his feeding standards. <br> The group of nitrogenous compounds are those containing the element nitrogen in combination with larger amounts of carbon, hydrogen and oxygen, and smaller amounts of sulphur and sometimes phosphorus. The amounts of these elements vary somewhat, but usually about 35 to 40 |
