"People who caught influenza earlier in the season could get it
again, especially if a different strain hits," said Dr. W. Paul Glezen of the Influenza Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "But people who have
been vaccinated are likely to be protected. The two influenza $A$ viruses circulating are similar to those included in the current vaccine.
Flu season generally peaks in late January or early February, but
