It was only the sixth barrow title for a Farwell showman in the

## 9-1-1 System Set To Debut In Friona

Parmer County telephone subscribers will be able to access $9-1-1$ services beginning February 13, 1992. The Parmer County $9-1-1$ system is one of 23 planned systems to be implemented across the Panhandle of Texas.
The availability of 9-1-1 service in Parmer County was made possible through a cooperative effort with Parmer County, the cities of Bovina, Farwell and Friona, the Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network and the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission.
Local elected officials, law enforcement, emergency medical services and fire department personnel, local businesses and the citizens of the area have volunteered their services to ensure that the $9-1-1$ system will be successful.
A reception celebrating the beginning of 9-1-1 service will be held Thursday, February 13, 1992, from 2-5 p.m., at the Friona Police Department in Friona. The public is invited to attend.

## E. Hwy. 60 Traffic To Use New Lane

Weather permitting, the Contractor for the construction of U.S. Highway 60, from Friona to the Deaf Smith County line, will rout traffic to the new (north) roadway of this highway the first week in February.
For approximately two days, traffic will be routed over both roadways and U.S. 60 will function as a four-lane divided highway; however, after a detour is installed at the Castro-Deaf Smith County Line, all traffic will be placed on the new
