Its final report graphically report graphically illustrates the extensiveness of the safety precautions used in construction of Comanche Peak," Texas Electric Service Company President Bill Marquardt said in announcing the NRC's findings today. <br> Although <br> allegations were proved to have no merit with respect to the safety of the plant, we of the NRC investigation.
