Texas judge will tell jury how he posed as dead man

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — A soft-spoken Texas judge will tell a jury today how he posed as a dead man in an FBI scenario that led to the arrest of millionaire Cullen Davis.

Prosecutors contend it was a snapshot of the "slain" judge that convinced Davis last summer to hand over \$25,000 to friend-turned-

informant David McCrory. Minutes later, a small army of officers seized Davis and charged him with soliciting the murder of judge Joe Eidson.

Eidson, 61, then the judge presiding over the Davis divorce case, was the leadoff witness Monday in the murder-for-hire retrial of the Fort Worth industrialist.

Davis, 45, testified previously that he was never shown the snapshot of Eidson and that the \$25,000 was money he had been holding for McCrory for "safekeeping."

Proper inflated tires save oil

NEW YORK (AP) — Maintaining proper air pressure in new and retreaded tires not only extends tread wear, it's economical and saves oil as well, says Robert Berg, Berg, coordinator of the Tire Retread Information Bureau TRIB, says average inflation for most passenger tires is between 22 and 26 pounds a square inch. If a tire registers below that amount, "it generates excessive heat, which is a cancer that eats away at both the tire body and its tread and slowly destroys the integrity of the tire, and ultimately its safety."

"If a tire is overinflated, it eventually will fail as well. At the very least, it will prematurely wear out in the center of the tread," he adds.

Reno woman sues lingerie firm

RENO, Nev. (AP) — A woman has sued the lingerie firm Fredericks of Hollywood Inc. for \$10,000, alleging that she was wounded by a wire sticking from a bra. In the suit filed in Washoe District Court late last week, Roberta Kendall of Reno said she suffered "severe and permanent personal injury" which affected her mentally and physically. She blamed it on negligence in the design and manufacture of the bra. Ms. Kendall is seeking more than \$10,000 in general damages, plus medical, legal and other expenses.

FARMERS BRANCH, Texas (AP) — The nude body of Cheryl Susan Bellinger, 26, a stewardess for Braniff Airlines, was found Monday night in a bedroom of her family's home, police said. Detectives said her body

had numerous stab wounds. The victim's father, Neil Bellinger, a mechanic for Braniff, made the grim discovery about two hours after he returned home for work. When he walked into the house and called for his daughter but got no response

he said he assumed she was out jogging in this Dallas suburb. He told police he mowed the grass and about 8:30 p.m. decided to search the house, whereupon he found her body on the floor of her back bedroom.

Weather El Paso, Wink report showers

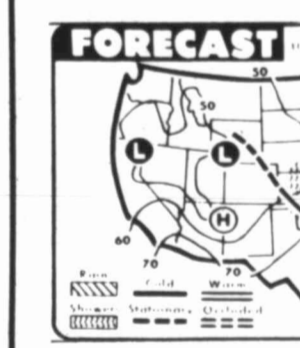

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Elvis Presley's 1968 El Dorado Cadillac is again up for sale, this time for at least \$25,000, according to its owner.

Terry McDonnell said Monday that the earlier reported sale of the late singer's car never occurred. It had been reported that a wealthy Saudi Arabian bought it for \$30,000 at an auction in June. McDonnell said the car contains the original Memphis, Tenn., registration papers made out to the Presley, who died on Aug. 16, 1977.

WASHINGTON (AP) — In 1840, New York state enacted the first law to ensure that the proceeds of a life insurance policy paid to a widow were exempt from claims of creditors, according to the American Council of Life Insurance.

Three Houston police officers cleared in deaths of two men

HOUSTON (AP) — Three Houston police officers were cleared Monday of any wrongdoing in the deaths of two men.

A Harris County grand jury cleared two officers in the March 8 shooting death of a man who shot at them when they answered a disturbance call to his home.

The grand jury heard no testimony before voting a no bill, prosecutor Jim Moseley said, relying on police reports and his investigation. Officers R.J. Fisher and J.L. McGee were cleared in the death of Bennie Bonner, 57, of Houston.

Patton died June 13 from head injuries. Wilson said the grand jury heard witnesses and read their statements, including some from prisoners in jail, and used his summary of the investigation.

Bonner opened fire on the two when they responded to a call. A friend had tried to persuade Bonner, who had been acting erratically, to go to a hospital. Bonner responded with a shotgun, Moseley said, and shot at the officers. Bonner was shot four times and died at the scene. The third officer was cleared in the death of a man

who fell in jail while scuffling there after his arrest. Officer M.W. Brunson had arrested James Charles Patton, 52, May 19 for public intoxication. Prosecutor Terry Wilson said Patton swung at Brunson, who warded off the blow knocking Patton to the concrete floor. Patton died June 13 from head injuries. Wilson said the grand jury heard witnesses and read their statements, including some from prisoners in jail, and used his summary of the investigation.

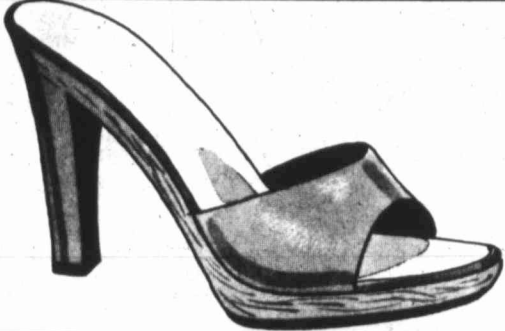

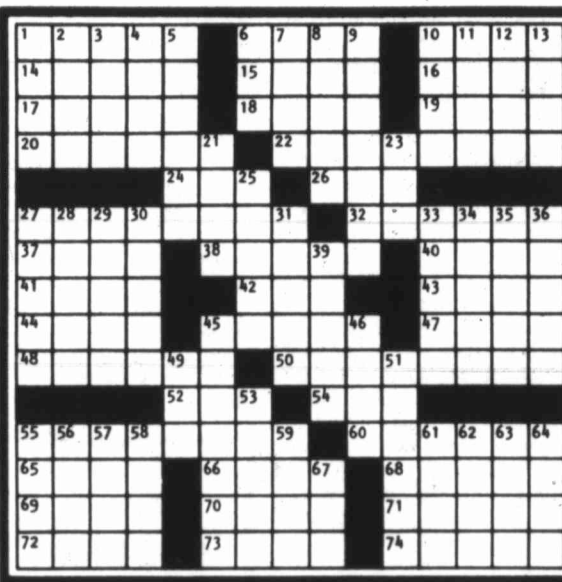

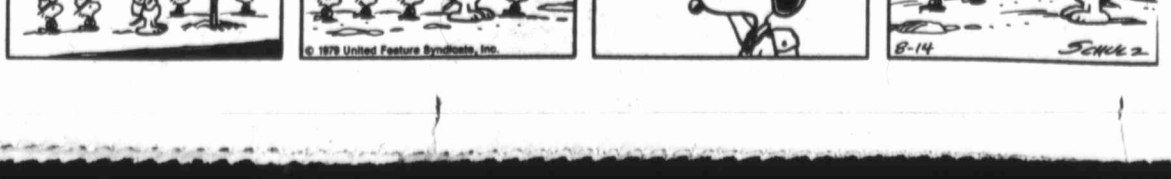
