Star Lites

IT'S THE TIME of year once again for severe weather, and storms of the past week have made us painfully aware of something that affects the residents of Parmer County.

That is the fact that the National Weather Service in Amarillo, which supplies the storm warnings for the three Amarillo television stations, as well as their radio stations, never appears to "get their act together" until the storm systems have already moved through Parmer County.

Case in point was Tuesday, when a tornado-laden cloud moved through the county, and several folks in Friona saw evidence of twisters.

About ten to fifteen minutes after the storm had done its act in Friona, the TV stations began to get their warnings from the National Weather Service. By then, the cloud was already through with Parmer County. At least the folks in Hereford and Deaf Smith County were forewarned, in case they wanted to take any precautions.

This is no 1987 phenomenon, either. Ye editor has been an astute weather observer all his life, being raised by an old-time farmer whose entire livelihood depended upon the weather. We can recall precious few times that the Amarillo NWS ever put out a warning that would do the folks in central or western Parmer County any good at all.

We don't know what the reason for this problem is. The only thing we can figure out is that by the time the people at the NWS determine that a particular cloud might pose a threat to Amarillo, and begin to put out warnings, most of the time it has already passed Parmer County.

As these clouds develop (and they generally follow the path we described earlier, moving from southwest to northeast), you will then begin to see more and more weather bulletins as the evening wears on.

We are always prone to ask "That's fine, but where were you 30 minutes or an hour ago, when we would have liked a little warning?"

The Oklahoma Panhandle and Southern Kansas get more weather notice from Amarillo than do the southwestern counties of Texas.

But-if Parmer County residents have any cause to be upset about the methods used by the National Weather Service in their storm warnings, then those in Clovis and Curry County, N.M., have a right to be furious.

The same thing we have said about Parmer County is true for the folks just across the state line, except it's worse, because the cloud was over them 30 minutes to an hour before it gets to us, in most cases.

And Clovis is a sizeable city. If we in the Texas Panhandle and High Plains feel left out by the politicians, then we probably have an idea of how Clovis residents feel in regard to the weather alert situation.

Although Amarillo TV and radio give "lip service" in their attempts to cover Clovis' news, the fact is that that city is on their "fringe area." It is the same proximity from Lubbock, and although we're not as familiar with the National Weather Service trends from Lubbock, we would suspect that the service there would be similar as from Amarillo.

The next closest NWS facility is probably in Albuquerque, N.M., and we're not aware of anyone who watches Albuquerque television for their weather news.

They don't mind making a pitch for our shopping dollars in Amarillo. How's about giving us a look more often (and lots earlier) when severe weather threatens. Heck, we probably spawn nine out of ten of your bad weather systems. It would be well worth their time to keep an eye out toward the west.

FUNNELS SEEN

Area Reels Under Weather Assault

The Friona area has been buffeted with severe weather during the past week, which included a brush with tornado clouds and severe hail. For the week, the city received a total of 2.75 inch of rainfall.

Added to the rain which had been received during the previous week, most of the farmland, gardens and yards in the area have received a generous watering.

On the "down" side of the weather story was the damage to crops, roofs and vehicles due to the bad hailstorm of Sunday afternoon, May 24.

Marble to golf ball sized hail pelted the city and parts of the area that afternoon, and a deluge dropped .75 inch of rain during the period. Friday night's measurement in Friona was 1.37 inches.

Farmers reported damage to wheat crops, especially in the Rhea area and in the state line vicinity. Some young cotton also has been damaged and replanting will be necessary in some cases.

Floyd Reeve said that the hail stripped up his young corn crop somewhat, but he thought the plants would bounce back. "All in all, the rain we have received has been real beneficial. Most of it has fallen just about right," Reeve said.

Many of the farmers say they have received around four inches of rain since it started about two weeks ago.

For most of the past week, rain has been received virtually on a daily basis. But Tuesday was the most frantic day locally, when a

funnel cloud threatened the city. The tornado warning was sounded, and the warning was also broadcast to local cable customers during the noon hour.

Ed Lemons, manager of Sutter's Inn on West Highway 60 was one of those spotting the funnel cloud. Lemons said he first saw the trash dumpsters behind the Dairy Queen being rolled along on the ground. He also saw what appeared to be rocks being whirled around in the area between the Dairy Queen and the motel parking lot.

Lemon, his wife, and their daughter, Beverly Wagner, looked out a window in the motel's laundry room and saw the funnel dip slightly from the cloud as it passed over the city.

The strong wind also was felt at Reeve Chevrolet-Olds, where Glenn E. Reeve, Jr., said some trim was ripped from the top of the building, and it appeared that the wind tried to lift the roof from the building.

The biggest loss sustained at the car agency, however, was during Sunday's hailstorm, when a number of new cars were severely damaged. Similar reports were heard from Friona Ford-Mercury, as well as from car owners around town whose vehicles were outside at the time.

The Tuesday wind also blew down a fence at the Bill Stephens residence, which is just north of Reeve's.

A member of the Hereford Sheriff's Department spotted a funnel which touched down in an open field between Friona and Hereford, causing no damage.

Hereford police reported several funnel clouds over the eastern half of Deaf Smith County from the system which had earlier passed over Friona.

Continuing the week of unusual weather, residents were awakened at about 2:30 a.m. on Wednesday by an electrical storm.

The early-morning storm was responsible for lightning striking the Robert Neelley residence, 1611 W. 10th Street, and causing damage to the home's wiring. The Neelleys were awakened a few hours after the storm when their doorbell began ringing constantly, a result of the damage to the wiring.

Again on Thursday, a potentially dangerous cloud passed over the area, around 5 p.m. Several observers reported seeing funnel activity in the cloud south toward Hub, but again there was no damage reported.

City Manager Beelce Goodwin, speaking to the Friona Evening Lions Club Thursday night, said that the experience of Tuesday served as a good exercise for the city in its storm warning system.

"We were quite fortunate that there was no bad damage from this storm," said Goodwin. The city manager pointed out that discrepancies were noted in the city's warning system during Tuesday's emergency, and that steps were being taken to correct these shortcomings.

As a result, a second warning system (outside siren) was installed. This system was tested just before noon on Thursday, in case residents wondered about this particular siren.

All in all, it has been a harrowing week for the area's residents, and most folks are hoping for a clearing trend. Coming on the heels of the tragic storm that devastated the small town (Saragosa) many miles south of here, the storm clouds have made people a little more cautious than usual.

Medina of Friona has been selected along with nine other American teenagers to spend this summer in the Philippines with Filipino volunteer host families under a scholarship program funded by the United States Information Agency and administered by Youth For Understanding (YFU) International Exchange.

As scholarship recipients under the U.S.-Philippines Exchange Program, Diana and her American colleagues will be given a first hand look at Filipino society through the host family living experience.

YFU was chosen to coordinate this effort in light of its 21-year history of successful programs in the Philippines during which period it has become one of that nation's pre-eminent exchange organizations.

One of the world's oldest and largest student exchange organizations, YFU is a private, non-profit educational organization dedicated to international understanding and world peace. Founded in 1951, YFU is based in more than two dozen countries with 13 regional offices in the U.S., an International Center in Washington, D.C., a worldwide network of 250 employed and 3,000 volunteer staff and more than 125,000 alumni.

The U.S.-Philippines Scholarship Program was established to help familiarize Americans with the new democracy established under the Aquino government. The grant includes funding to bring eight Filipino students to the U.S. on the YFU program to spend an academic year living with volunteer American host families and attending American high schools.
