## EXPLANATION OF TAX INCREASE NOTICE SHOWN BELOW

In compliance with state law your county must run in a public newspaper the amount of income increase for the 1980-81 county budget. The Commissioners' Court wants all taxpayers to note your local faxes have dropped from ${ }^{\mathbf{5} .2375}$ per hundred dollar evaluation to $\$ .20$ per hundred. This amounts to a $15 \%$ decrease in your taxes. In the "Notice of Tax Increase" adjacent to this notice you will note a $44 \%$ proposed increase. This increase is due to mineral evaluation in our county and not an increase in your taxes.

If your property did not increase in value (all property owners who had increases were mailed notices of that increase during May' 1980), then you will have a $\$ .0375$ per $\$ 100$ or $15 \%$ decrease in taxes owed for 1980

There has not been an increase in the last 11 years but this will represent the second decrease during this 11 year period.
