Briggs said in a telephone interview from St. Paul, Minn
"We think it's targeted at Burlington Northern and that it's unfair,"
The Santonio provision was the last issue preventing
a compromise between the House and Senate versions of the railroad deregulation bill, and Sen. Howard Cannon D-Nev., said the only reason he removed his objection wa ospeed the bill to the floor.
I am strongly opposed to he reasonableness of particular rotes shin, since I believe mined by the (Interstate Commerce) Commission deter courts, Cannon said. The amendment does not mention San Antonio or
Burlington Northern by name but it describes the situation specifically.
Loefflier said Texas senators had helped persuade the Senate negotiators to retain the San Antonio provision.
