Elda Hart, hospital administrator, said that a new Kodak Analyzer will cost around $\$ 10,000$. This is over twice what the project usually raises, but Elda says the hospital could borrow the rest of the money if needed. She points out that for the hospital's old machine, service contracts runs $\$ 3200$ per year, meaning the new machine --which virtually requires no service--would pay for itself in about three years,
The new machine would be faster and more accurate, being computerized. At the present time, much of the hospital's tests have to be "farmed out," either to Amarillo or Hereford.
