Again this season it will be necessary for hunters to buy a hunting license if they plan to hunt anywhere other than on their own homestead. Game wardens will in all probability be checking for violators of this law.

> A good hunting season is anticipated. Large numbers of birds have been spotted in the area, and reports from across the state line in New Mexico indicated that their season, held last weekend, was a good one.

The bag limit will remain the same as in years past: two cocks per day and four in possession. Only the cock pheasants are legal game.

A large influx of hunters is expected for the opening weekend of the season this weekend.

A contest for the hunter turning in the longest tailfeather will be held sponsored by the Parmer County Game Management Association. Details on where to turn in the feather entries will be announced next week.

Texas followed the lead of its neighboring state, New Mexico, with the passage of House Bill 1421, which authorized the formation of Operation Game Thief. Concerned citizens may calla 24-hour toll-free number, 1-800-792-GAME, to report flagrant violations of Texas' wildlife and fish laws.

Since implementing its game thief program in 1976, New Mexico has collected over \$79,000 in fines and paid almost \$40,000 in rewards.


### **Shelton Is Killed In** Accident



An open house will be held at the Parmer County Farmers Home Administration office on Tuesday, December 15 from 2-4 p.m. to demonstrate the (new) computer system, according to FmHA County Supervisor, Weldon C. Rainey.

"Once we plug basic numbers into the machine, we can help determine which management decisions will be the most beneficial. We'll be able to project annual cash-flow figures quickly and accurately. "In addition, we can go directly into the FmHA main frame computer in Kansas City," Rainey said. "We expect this equipment will also help us to process applications quicker than we have in the past. Our office will be open to the public between 2-4 p.m. on Tuesday, December 15, and we welcome anyone who is interested in seeing how the new automation system works," he concluded. The FmHA County office is located at 207 Avenue D in Farwell.
