"first fancy," But Bette never wanted to be Miss America and shortly
before dawn on the first morning of her reign, she called Lou in tears, begging him to drive her home to rural
Hackettstown. Lou spirited her away to his boat and anchored just
off shore for 14 hours as angry pageant officials and state (roopers scoured the New Jersey countryside for the
"missing Miss America" and her new Lou Off, now 66 , is happily married and businessman in nearby Linwood, growing lush orchids for New York City flower shops. His fling with Bette ended
