the first phase of the city's fiveyear capital improvements program.

Amendment 5 helps farmers
Proposed Amendment 5 in next Tuesday's election deserves a "yes" vote. It is the
amendment to exempt livestock and poultry from property taxation.
This amendment actually is a correction
in language. In 1879, the Texas Constitution declared that all farm products would be exempt from taxation. Supposedly that include livestock and poultry. General John Hill
But in 1976, Attorney Germ products but
ruled that crops were farm livestock and poultry weren't Amendment 5 simply puts cattle and
chickens back in the category of farm chickens back in the category of farm
products.

THE AMENDMENT would cure a large inequity in taxing across the state. Many
school district do not tax livestock or poultry at all, while others do. Also, it is
difficult to tax livestock because it's hard to find them on the range and count them

By eliminating the tax, voters would b eliminating an expensive and tim some cases it costs more to administer the tax than would be gained by taxation. Some jurisdictions use airplanes to count
animals. Others spend hours driving through rangeland.

Another example of the current inequity is that someone who puts cattle in feedyard on Dec. 31 must pay property
taxes on 100 percent of the cattle, because they will be counted by the tax assessor on Jan. 1, the day property is appraised. $A$
neighbor who puts cattle in the feedyard on Jan. 2 may be taxed on very few animals, since animals on the range are rarely
counted The tax puts the feedyard counted. The tax puts the feedyard industry
at a competitive disadv untage with those states whose livestock are not taxed.
SOME PEOPLE have argued that schools
will suffer because of the tax loss. Actually will suffer because of the tax loss. Actually,
the revenue from taxation of livestock
statewide currently is less than one-fourth
of one percent en all tax revenue of one percent of all tax revenue.
Another argument has been that this amendment would give ranchers and farm ers a tax break, and why should they get on when automobile dealers, for example, have to pay taxes on their cars. The dif
ference is that businesses can pass on the costs of property taxes to consumers by setting their price, but ranchers must ac-
cent the market rate and are unable to pass
Last but not least, Amendment 5 will be a
significant step in helping hold down the cost of livestock ind helping hold down the cost of livestock and poultry production in
Texas. This action is a step we can take to
help hold down rising food costs.
