Previously, by the time Texas
had its primary (in May), the delegate race was either decided in
favor of one candidate or another or was so hopelessly messed up
hat whatever Texas voters did wouldn't change anything.
This, plus the fact that under the
old system, Texas' delegates were old system, Texas' delegates were
not decided by the voters when they cast their primary ballots, but
were chosen in the cumbersome, confusing precinct conventions. Personally, I feel that the
changing of this situation for changing of this situation for
Texas voters for 1988 was one of the biggest steps forward the state
has made in years. Now, the presidential candidates can be given their delegates according to
public opinion. It will actually be public opinion. It will actually be
determined by who does what on the ballot on election day. We realize that moving the
primary dates up as early as the parties did for 1988 has proven to
be somewhat of a hardship county race candidates, who had a

But whether or not our state's

## Bovina Ex-POW Awarded Bronze Star From W.W. II

By SCOOTER RUSSELL Blade News Editor Luis Serna of Bovina was
recently presented the Bronze Star for service rendered to his country during World War II. for a time during the war, and this for a time during the war, and this
week shared some of experiences with us.
Serna was twenty-two years old
aten when he enlisted in the U.S. Army the time he entered the service in May of 1943.
Serna had a wife and a small son at the time of his enlistment. He was in "boot camp" in Abilene,
and was then sent to Fort Bliss in El Paso, and later to Camp
Aterberry, Indiana. He said his Aterberry, Indiana. He said his family was with him for part of this early period of service.
Then he shipped out to Germany, on the huge Queen Germany, on the huge Queen
Mary, which carried so many
thousands of young Americans thousands of young Americans across the Atlantic. On December 10, 1944, he saw combat in the
Schnee-Eiffel area. Schnee-Eiffel area.
On December 16
regiment was hit by the Germa's Ardennes counter-offensive, and was quickly cut off from its main group.
was quickly cut off from its main order to boil coffee at night.

On the night of December 17 , his time as a prison wer, at one time the regiment was in battle, and all getting down to just 92 pounds. were killed or captured except for nine officers and 70 men. Serna could not remember the num
that had started in his group that had started in his group.
After they were captured, of the men were marched for over a week, covering 500 miles. They
were scattered in POW camps were scattered in
throughout Germany. Sometimes the men rode in
boxcars on the railway, and were boxcars on the railway, and were
at times kept in the boxcars for
days at a time. He said at one time
days at a time. He said at one time
they were in a boxcar whe being heavily bombed by the Americans.
Serna said
Germans meant mer felt that the killed by their own armed forces. He said they spent a lot of time praying during those three days. The prisoners were kept in a big building with straw mats to sleep
on. They were fed two potatoes per on. They were fed two potatoes per
day, and Serna felt that they would not have survived except for the Red Cross, which came with
supplies about every Red Cross, which came with
supplies about every three weeks. The Red Cross gave the men
coffee, cigarettes and canned coffee, cigarettes and canned
goods. The men always shared equally with one another.

forced to work forced to work on the railroad, but Luis said he was never put to work
during the five months he was held during the five months he was held
prisoner. were not physically
They They were In order to pass their time, the men would walk around and around their compound. They only had the clothes they were wearing, the men would save their fuel in his time as a prisoner, at one
getting down to just 92 pounds. Serna said there were several

was "missing in action," and did was "missing in action," and did
not hear from him for four months.
