A weekly mail service established for our farmers south of town. We will be able to give them service just as soon as we get City Delivery.

Postal laws prohibit rural carriers who live within the limits of a city not hearing delivery. But when they carry delivery, rural carriers can serve patrons within the city and thus serve the required number of people for a daily route.

I earnestly appeal to our good men in behalf of the farmers of town, who will be benefited by this service.

The farmer is justly entitled to consideration and assistance to him we must look for thrift, progress, happiness and prosperity. With the parcel post system of daily rural mail service, we will benefit the farmer's good and add much to her happiness.

Some have said to me that they do not care for City delivery in a small town, as they could not be served by both the post office and carrier, and with irregular train service, they could not get their mail promptly. I want to assure you that rules and regulations of other post offices do not apply to this office and you have no cause for objection to city delivery because they do so and

so at other places. I want to say to you, that when the mail arrives after the carrier has departed from the office, you can come to the post office and get your mail. To be sure that will necessitate additional work on our part, but it is never to be considered when the best interest of our patrons are at stake.

I will say to you too, that you can not get mail after office hours or on Sunday at but few post offices in the country.

We do not give the people mail on Sunday, because we do not believe in keeping the Sabbath, but because our sympathy is for the working men who are often unable to get to the post office during week days, and for the traveling men who make our town, and spend Sunday with us. It is a great inconvenience, to traveling men to arrive in town on Saturday night or Sunday morning and have important mail in the post office and be unable to get it.

I have no patience with any man who will fortify himself behind rules and regulations, and refuse to accommodate a traveling man.

Assuring you that if you will assist us in securing City Delivery, we will give you efficient service.

BAR PASSES RESOLUTIONS IN HONOR OF JUDGE EIDSON

Sweetwater, Tex.
To Hon. W. W. Beall, Judge 32nd Judicial Dis. of Tex We, your Committee appointed to prepare suitable resolutions in memory of our deceased Brother lawyer and friend, Judge J. F. Eidson, and to present same to a meeting of the Bar Association of Nolan county to be held on Monday, October 27th, 1913, beg leave to submit the following report.

WHEREAS, Judge J. F. Eidson was one of the early settlers of Nolan County and as shown by the records of this Court he was a Deputy Sheriff of Nolan County in 1882, on March 23rd, 1883, before Judge T. B. Wheeler, this Court granted Judge Eidson license to practice law, J. B. Scarborough of this Bar, J. D. Martin of Colorado City and K. K. Leggett of Abilene being the committee of examiners; this committee at the same time examined and granted license to Hon. S. H. Cowan now of Ft. Worth. From that time until his death Judge Eidson was actively engaged in the practice of his profession in the Courts of West Texas. The records of this Court also show that he was a member of the Committee of Examiners that granted license to practice law to your Honor in 1887. Judge Eidson is therefore oldest member in point of admission and time engaged in practice of the Nolan County Bar.

Judge Eidson served two terms as County Judge of Nolan county in 1891 to 1892 and in 1894 to 1896 which position he filled with ability. The building in which this meeting is now being held was constructed during Judge Eidson's administration as County Judge.

Judge Eidson also served as Mayor of the City of Sweetwater and in other positions of trust and responsibility with credit and success. And

WHEREAS, It has pleased the All Wise Ruler of the Universe to take from his sphere of usefulness our friend Judge J. F. Eidson, and

WHEREAS, His loss will fall heavily on a devoted wife, children, brothers and other relatives and

WHEREAS, He has practiced law for so many years in the Court of Nolan County and this section of Texas, with such eminent devotion to the interest of his clients, courtesy to his fellow members of the Bar; marked ability in the trial of cases at the Bar that it is but a small, but fitting, recognition of the place the departed Brother filled, to here and now resolve:

1st: That in the death of Judge Eidson the Bar of Nolan County has suffered a distinct and great loss.

2nd: That he was always alert, loyal and intelligent in representing the right and interests of his clients; loyal to his friends, faithful and scrupulously careful in living up to every agreement made with a Brother lawyer.

3rd: That the widow and family of our Brother be furnished with a copy of these resolutions, with the assurance of the sympathy of this Bar in their distress.
