| Wood and could never get an answer from him. <br> About three and a half years after Wood had been here, in August 1907, a client of mine was here from the same town that Miller was said to live in. I recalled this fact, and asked my client to ascertain Miller's address and send it to me, as he own. ed a lot here which I wanted to buy, if he had not already sold it. Thus I got Miller's address.
