





14, 127,356 BALES GROWN IN 1913 WASHINGTON, March 20-One of the largest cotton crops ever grown amounting to 14,127,546, equivalent 500-pound bales of line and 639, 595 equivalent 500-pound bales of linters was produced by the farmers of the United States during 1913, the Census Bureau announced today in its preliminary report of cotton ginned as reported by ginners and delinters to February 28.

These figures compare with 13,703,-421 equivalent 500-pound bales of lint and 609, 594 bales of linters last year, and 15,692,701 bales of lint and 557,-575 bales of linters in 1911.

The Department of Agriculture's estimate, announced December 12, placed the 1913 crop at 13,677,000 equivalent 500-pound bales.
