New Orleans, Oct. 1 .- By Courier to Baton Rouge. Toll exacted by hurricane which swept this city Wednesday includes nineten known dead and near two hundred injured, many of whom may die. The damage to buildings, property, shipping and railroads is estimated at several millions of dol-

Of the known dead ten are white and nine are negroes. Business was resumed today. The sun shone brightly to day and the work of clearing the streets of debris commenced. A crevasse caused by a break in the leves on the Mississippi River at Ironton was reported today. Water is said to be flooding the plantations but no loss of life has been reported there.
