# Honor of Captain Smith

The sculpture is the work of Miss Clyde Chandler, formerly a Dallas girl now living in Chicago, who was commissioned two years ago to mould the foundatin memorial.

The group contains four figures, supported by concrete foundation with a basin 35 feet in diameter. It is intended to symbolize the four predominating elements in Texas. The highest figures in the group is called "The Mountain," the next "The Prairie" then "The Gulf" and lastly "The Gulf


