| J. H. H. Higginbotham of the Agricultural Department at Wash ington spent Tuesday and Wednesday here on a new mission. It will be remembered that last fall the Government placed an embargo on all cotton and cotton seed from certain districts in Mexico where the Pink Boll Worm had made its appearance. <br> Before the embargo went into effect however, a number of oil mills in Texas had bought and shipped into the state seed from the territory where the new cotton pest had made its appearance. <br> Mr. Higginbotham, together with other representatives of the Federal Agricultural Departmeny is now making a personal examination of all the oil mills in the state in quest of cotton seed from the infested district. B. Ter-rell that there is approximately $\$ 1,000,000$ in inheritance taxes due the state of Texas. He says little effort is being made to regulate tax collectors to collect this tax. <br> With a view of collecting inheritance taxes, a bill inrtoduced in the house by representative Boner authorizing the comptroller to con tract with private tax eollectans over the state for the collection of the tax, already has passed the house.
