# TO THE PEOPLE OF TEXAS: 

We think not.
The operating expenses of railroads af fect the public just as much as the taxe they pay. In one instance the taxes ar collected by public officials; in the other instance the rates fixed by public official are collected by the railroads.
It is just as impossible for the Legislature or the courts and juries to impose un just burdens upon the railroads without at the same time placing the burden upon the shoulders of the producers and ship pers, as it is to create new public office and expeot the taxpayers to be relieved of meeting the expenses of such places. Under the present system of levying taxes in Texas, the State Tax Board takes into consideration the appropriations made by the Legislature and levies a tax high enough to bring in sufficient money to meet the expenses of government.
In fixing freight rates, the same rule applies. The commission, after ascertain ing what the railroads have to pay out for operating expenses, taxes, personal injuries, etc., fixes the rates high enough to pay all such expenses and in addition thereto
fair return on the value of the property used for the public. Therefore, the higher the operating expenses, taxes, and person al injury payments, the higher must be the rates the people have to pay.
It is the sincere desire of the manager of the Texas railroads to give the public good service, and at the least possible cost to you. And we respectfully and earnestly ask you, in your own interest, to assist us in doing so, and thereby protect yourselves against unjust and necossary bur. dens.
We desire to express our appreciation to the producers of Texas who have made a study of the question, and have taken intelligent action to protect themselves against the infliction of unjast and un ecessary burdens.
We respectfully ask you to study this so-called "Railroad Heoblem" closely We welcome the most searching and min ute inquiry. There is so much in common between the raiffoads and the producers, that a better ihderstanding and closer cooperation is'bound to benefit all concern ed.

ing upon higher education in the state. Most every one has read the different parts of the amend ment, but it is grossly misunder
stood by some. In faet there nly one seetion of this amend cussion, and that is to give the egislature power to to gissue bonds purposed of the Governor, for
purchasing additiona grounds and erecting necessar buildings for state institution
limited bond issue for the Uni versity of Texas. By a vote of 2 to 2 the Senate passed this Sen ate Joint Resolution No. 18 and the House passed it with of vot of 113 to 2.

It can be seen from the abo that the bonds to be issued for the University will not cost the tax payers once cent. It is jas giving the Legislature power to permit the Eniversity to use it credit. At present the Universi ty is the only organization in the state that is prohibited by the Constitution from issuing bond and paying for them with their revenues. When a county wishes to build a court honse, they issue bonds and pay them off out
of their revenues; now if the of their revenues; now if the amendment passes the Legislature
will be able to issue bonds for the University and they will be paid University and the of of the University revenues
off When the county issnes bonds, the taxes in the adjoining co the
ties are not raised at all: so the bonds for the University would not raise the people's taxes at all.
There is a limit to the amoun of bonds to be issued, for they are secured by the income from the permanent fund of the University, and are limited by that amount. If the amendment passes the constitution still forbids paying any money derived from taxation for the University buita ings.

"The Agricultural and Mechan cal College of Texas, established by an act of the Legislature pass ed April 17, 1871, located in the county of Brazos, is hereby mad and constituted a branch of th University of Texas, for instrue tion in agriculture, the mechani arts, and the natural sciences co Bected therewith.
Both of these sections remain absolutely unchanged, and the re will remain exactly two school is will remain exactly as it is, wheth rejected.
The Universities of California Michigan, Ohio, Mintesota and ued at from $\$ 5,000,000$ to $\$ 9,000$, 000 . The buildings of the Univer sity of Texas, including the Med ical Department, are valued a $\$ 1,250,000$. This ineludes the five wooden shacks at Austin, whic were erected to tempororily re lieve the congestion there. The campusses of the former Univer sities oecupy from 150 to 200 acres and that of the University of Tex as only 40 acres.
