The bodies of Mrs. Ethel Denecamp, aged 21 and W. E. Holt aged 45, were found on a lonely road five miles from Waco on the night of January 19th. The bodies were horribly mutilated. That of Holt had been dragged apparently for miles behind an auto.

Curfew Law, Early Closing And Depor-tation of German Officials Mark Days Events In Ruhr.

RUHR VALLEY IN STATE OF SIEGE

General Ludendorf Blames the World War On French Militarism And Says Present Invasion Part

By The United Press. ESSEN, Jan. 30, — German Inhabitants of the Ruhr and the Rhineland districts paid heavily today for their wea-ponless guerilla warfare" on France's army of invasion.

Each instance of sabotage was met by a stern tightening up of the military grip. Officials who refused to recognize the military authorities were promptly deported from

# DISEASE STALKS **WITH STARVATION**

Constantinople is City of a Thousand Sorrows As Refugees Press Hopelessly Into Confines.

MOTHERS DESERT CHILDREN

Greece, Anatolia, Asia Minor, Stricken As History Has Never Recorded-Misery And Death.

By The Associated Press.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 30 .- One hundred thousand refugees are seriously ill or dying on the coasts of Asia Minor, Thrace and the Greek mainland. No nation as such has come forward to help them. Private relief organizations seem helpless to cope with the entire problem. It is too vast. Greece is face to face with a social catastrophe. internal order and security are menaced by the hordes of starving and distracted fugitives pour-

ing into the country. Famine and disease are stalking through Anatolia, Thrace and the Ae gean islands. Women and children are dying everywhere. Even so great and precious a thing as mother-love cannot survive the agony and despair wroght Sea, mothers in the desperation are abandoning their children and fleeing for their lives on board any ship that will take them. The parentless children are left to the merciful hands of American women relief workers. Their fathers have long since been deported

In Thrace, Greek soldiers and refugees, maddened by hunger, are robbing and sacking the countryside. In Constantinople, a city of a thousand sorrows, pedestrians at night stumble over the half-dead forms of children huddled in doorways and alleys. CANNING FACTORY HERE.

practically every farmer and business man in Nolan County.

The question is: Will a canning out I will say that with proper encour-

agement, it will pay a good dividend to the promoters and farmers. One reason why some canning fac-torfes go "dead" is because the farm-ers generally expect to realize too much money out of their products the first year, then they quit the business

cold.
This outfit will not cost so very much money and can be run from three to four months, and give employ ment to hundreds of men, women and children.

Three or four months, during the dull season of the year, it is proposed to can tomatoes, sweet potatoes, beans, peas, okra, spinach, and other vegetables, if they are raised in quantities. We know people can raise tomatoes here to perfection when they exert a little energy and make proper preparations for the same.

Griff Jones has not made a failure in his production of sweet potatoes

in ten years. When it comes to beans, okra and black eyed peas, they are as easy to raise as falling off a log, therefore any person having a small strip of hand or garden spot can raise these items.

Sweetwater people can use approxipentaly 200,000 cans of peas in a year, because I know how they like them. West Texas could use over one mil-


