AT THE PALACE.

"Human Hearts" which opened an engagement of two days at the Palace theatre yesterday, is fully entitled to be termed "one of the really great pictures of the year." It is a story of mother love, a story of life in an American family. "Human Hearts" was written by Hal Reid, father of "Wally," and enjoyed an enviable success as a stage production a score of years back.

"Human Hearts" will catch the human hearts in any audience, and perchance put over a needed moral to the inhuman. It is of absorbing interest and moves along at a rapid rate. The piece while intensely dramatic has had light touches interpolated at occasional moments to nip a tear with a smile.

House Peters in the stellar role of Tom Logan brings to the part a sympathetic understanding that makes his characterization a real masterpiece and a personal triumph. The granite-hearted father senses her plan and cuts Tom out of his will. Later the father sees his daughter-in-law in the company of a released convict. He tries to stop her from running away and is killed. Tom fears his wife will be sent to prison and takes the guilt upon himself. In the end Tom is cleared after which a most dramatic scene is presented in the death of another party. King Bagot, Florence Lawrence's leading man, directed the production.

In addition to the big feature, "Mud

and Sand" a comedy that deals with bull fights, or merely a parody on "Blood and Sand," but in "Mud and Sand" Rhubard Vaselline has the leading role—it's some comedy.

(C.) To encourage the subordination of clothing to the efficiency, satisfaction, happiness and health of the individual. The Nolan County Clothing Contest will be held some time in April.

The girl who has the best suit of clothing for school wear will be the winner in this contest and will represent Nolan County at the state contest at College Station in July.

Both in the county and state contest the following points will be considered:

- Suitability of article to purpose.
- Beauty and quality of the design.
- Harmony of color and materials.
- Symmetry, accuracy in cutting.
