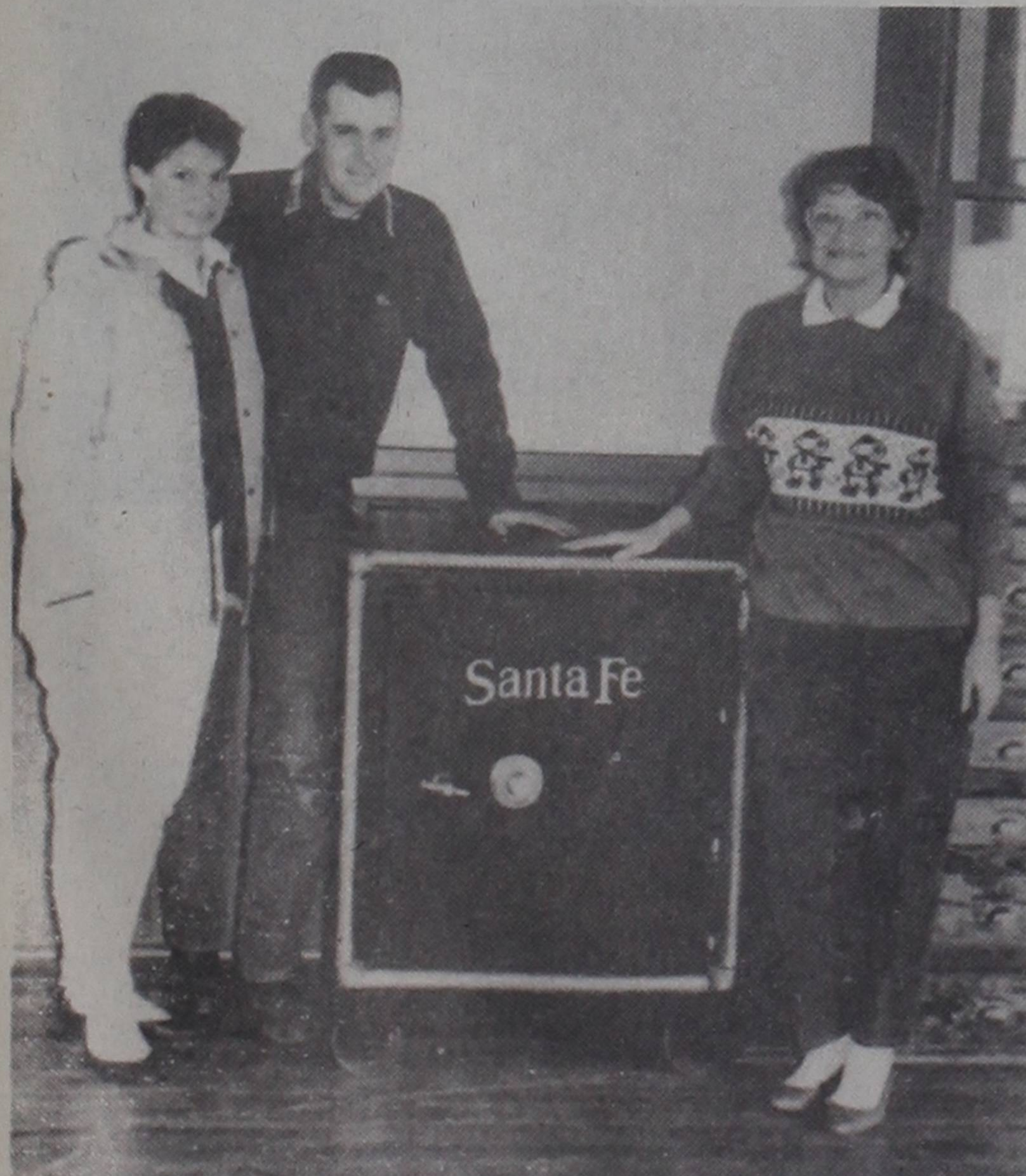

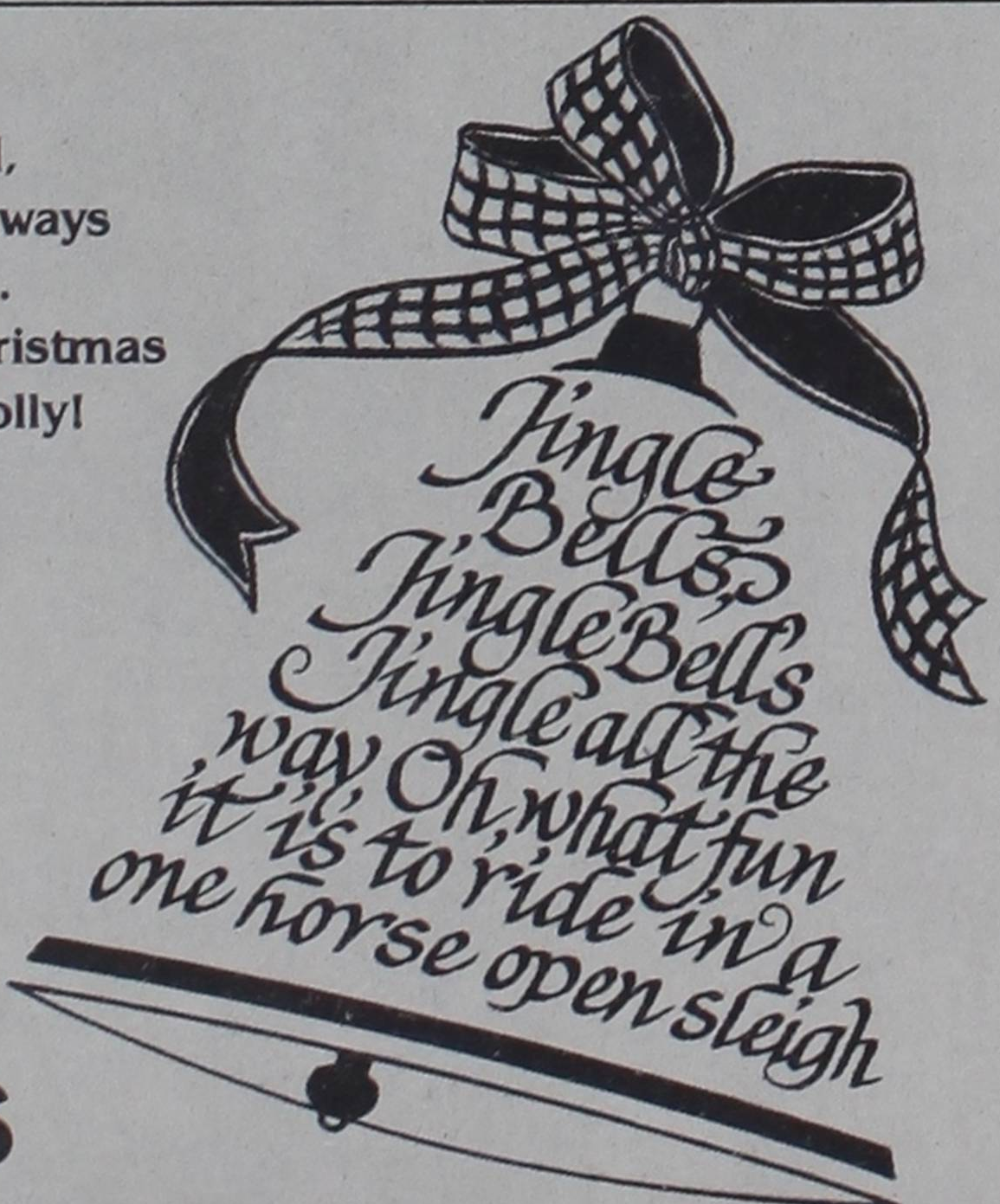

Wounded Elk Is Photographed Here

An almost grown elk was spotted by a number of pheasant hunters west of Friona during the past two weeks, and was finally put to sleep after coming up with two broken legs.

It was at first thought that the unusual visitor to the area might have been shot by hunters, but Dr. Bob Alexander said that after examining the body, the elk had broken two legs, a front leg and a back leg, and no earlier bullet wounds were discovered.

The animal was spotted the first weekend of pheasant season. He was spotted on the Ralph Wilson and Louis Welch places by hunters, and also by the Osborn boys on the S.H. Osborn place.

When spotted the first weekend, the animal seemed to be in perfect health.

"Some of my hunters told me about seeing the elk, and after I got tired of looking for pheasants, I went over to where they had hunted, hoping to spot the elk," said Louis Welch, who indicated that the elk was about as hard to spot as the pheasants were.

During the second week of the season, hunters again spotted the elk on the George Jones place, and he had the broken legs.

Dr. Alexander was summoned. He came out to observe the elk, and took photographs. The game warden was also called, and the men were given the authority to kill the elk.

It was theorized that the animal had followed Frio Draw, but it's anyone's guess how far he came,

and where he started from. A year or so ago, an elk was reported near the Bootleg corner.

Earlier this year, a trio of moose were seen and photographed in Hemphill County in the northern panhandle.

Seminar To Aid Farmers

An area-wide event designed to aid farm families who received notices in November from the Farmers Home Administration will be held Wednesday, December 21 at First United Methodist Church, 1411 Broadway.

"A Seminar For Farmers: The FmHA Loan Restructuring Process" will feature representatives from local agricultural agencies who will outline the processes for restructuring farm loans and using mediation services. Registration for the event will begin at 9 a.m. in Memorial Hall, with presentation beginning at 9:30 a.m. The seminar will conclude at 3:30 p.m.

Approximately 6,521 notices were sent by the FmHA in mid-November to farmers in Texas. An estimated two-thirds of those are farmers in the Panhandle and South Plains area. The letter, entitled, "notice of availability of loan services program for delinquent farm borrowers" informed farm families they must either restructure their delinquent FmHA loans within 45 days of receiving the notification, or face losing their farms.

Featured speakers will include Bill Stewart, Lubbock District

Supervisor of the Farmers Home Administration. He will address participants on the restructuring process and will be available for a one-hour question and answer session.

Also included will be Gary Condra, Director of the Texas Agricultural Loan Mediation Program and faculty member of the Department of Agricultural Economics at Texas Tech University. He will outline the loan mediation process available through his office, as established by the Agriculture Credit Act of 1987.

Following a lunch break from 12:30 to 2 p.m., the seminar will feature a videotape produced by Oklahoma State University which details the application process.

Sponsored by the Northwest Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church (Work Area on Church and Society), the event is open to all interested persons. There is no charge and each participant will be responsible for providing their own lunch.

Wilkins received his degree in computer information systems and will be able to participate in the 1989 Spring Commencement.

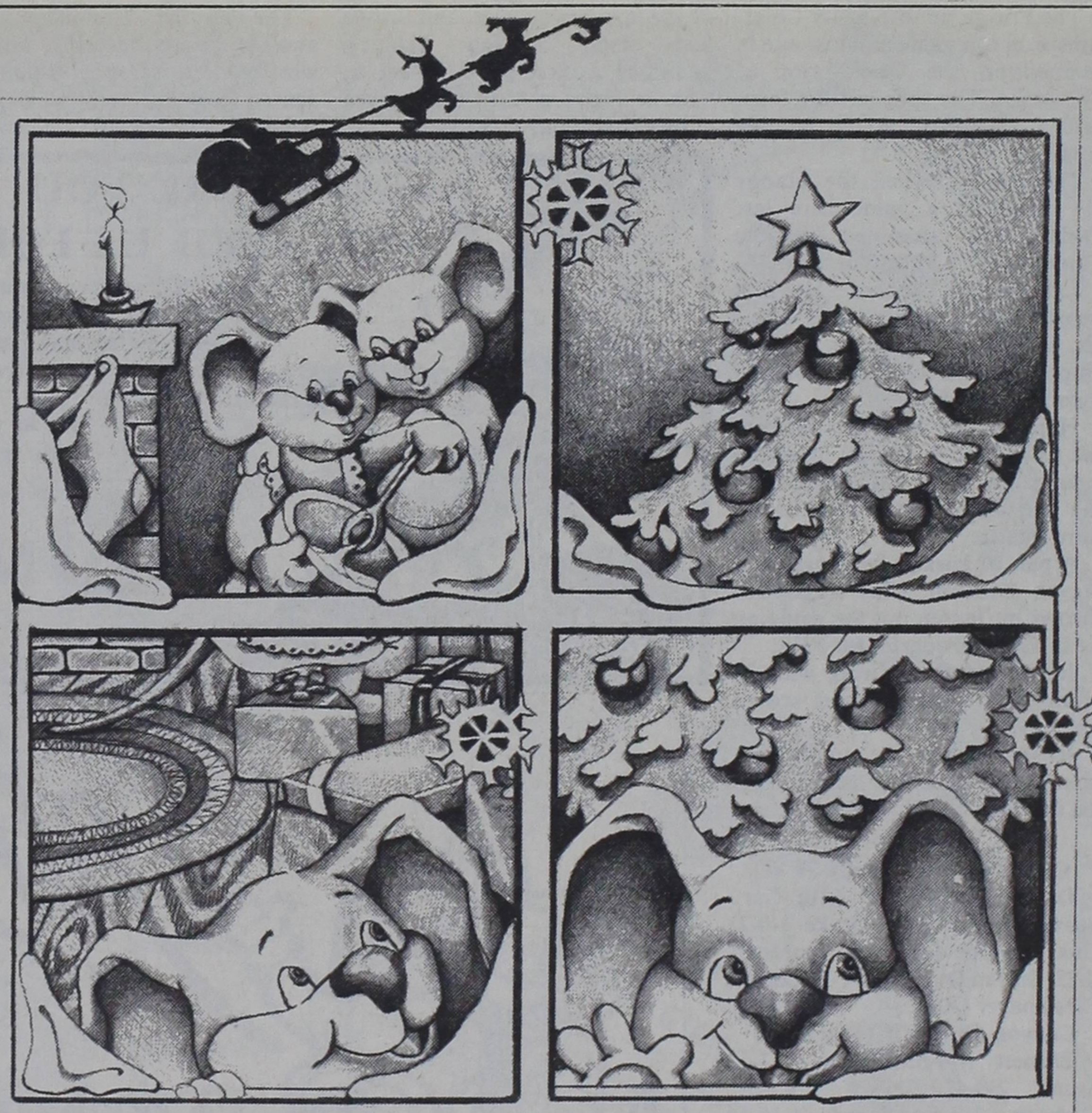

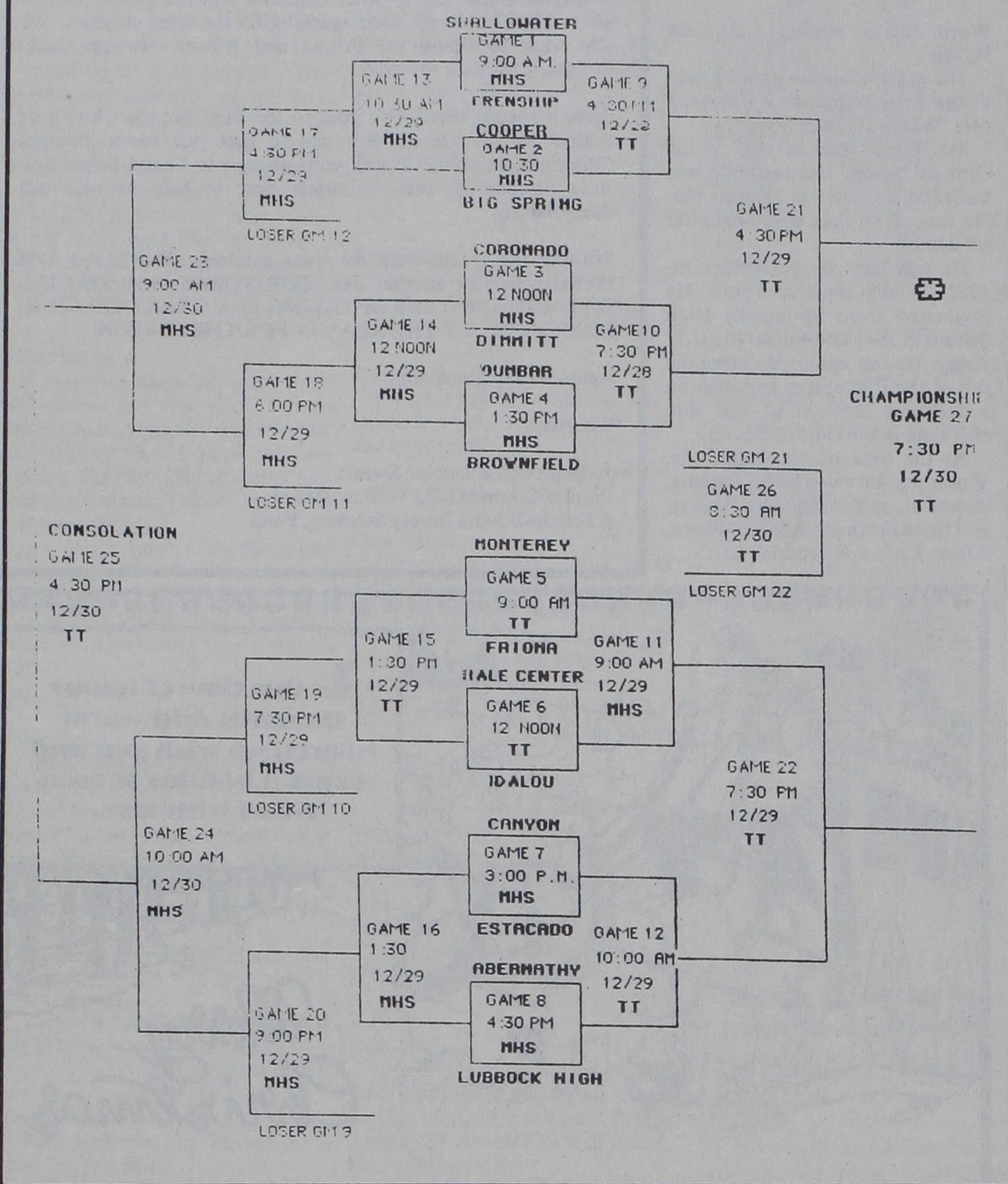

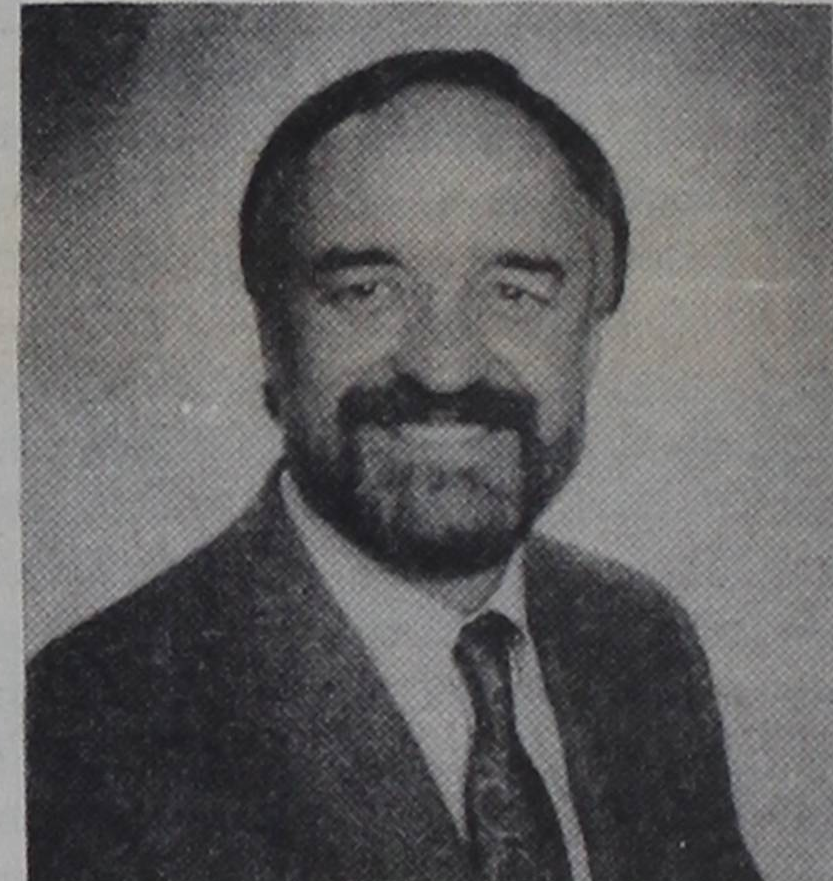

Cody Burney, 6-1, 165-pound senior, was named to the second team offense as its kicker, and Dunnam was named to a lineman spot on the second team offense.

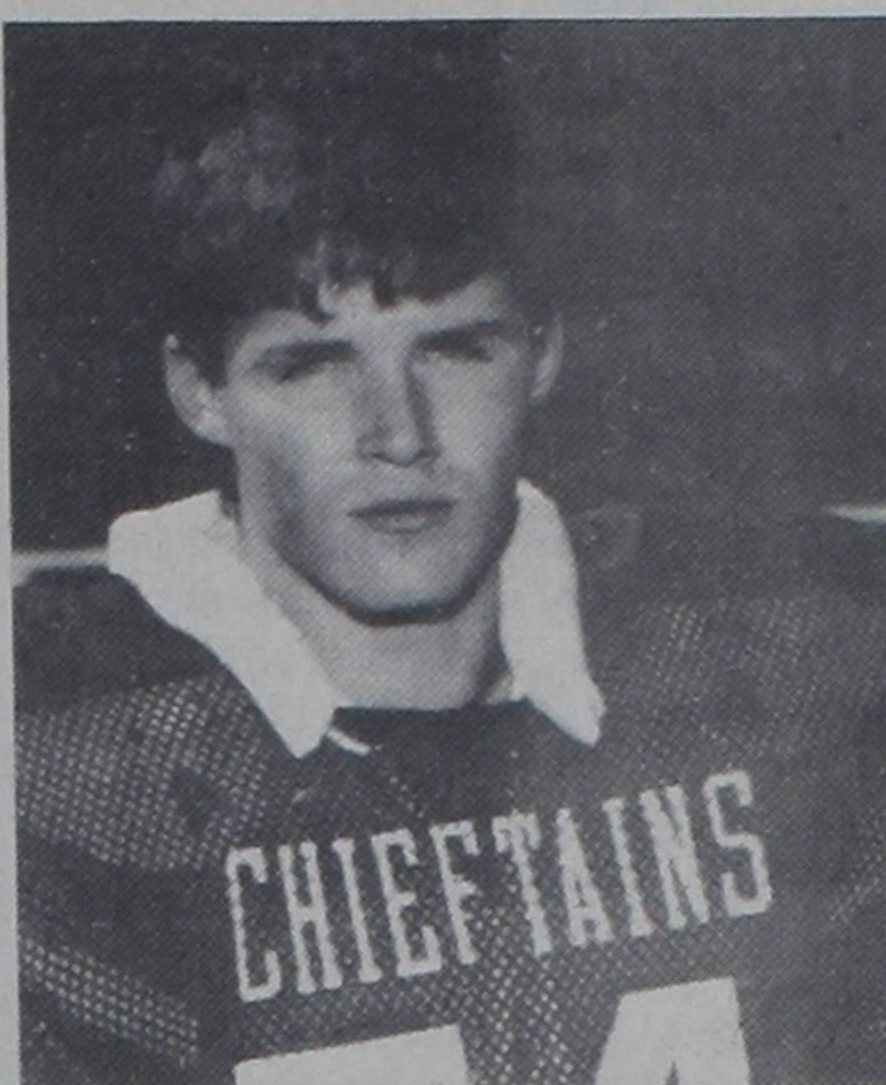
Burney was named to the second team defense at a cornerback position, one of two players chosen to that position.

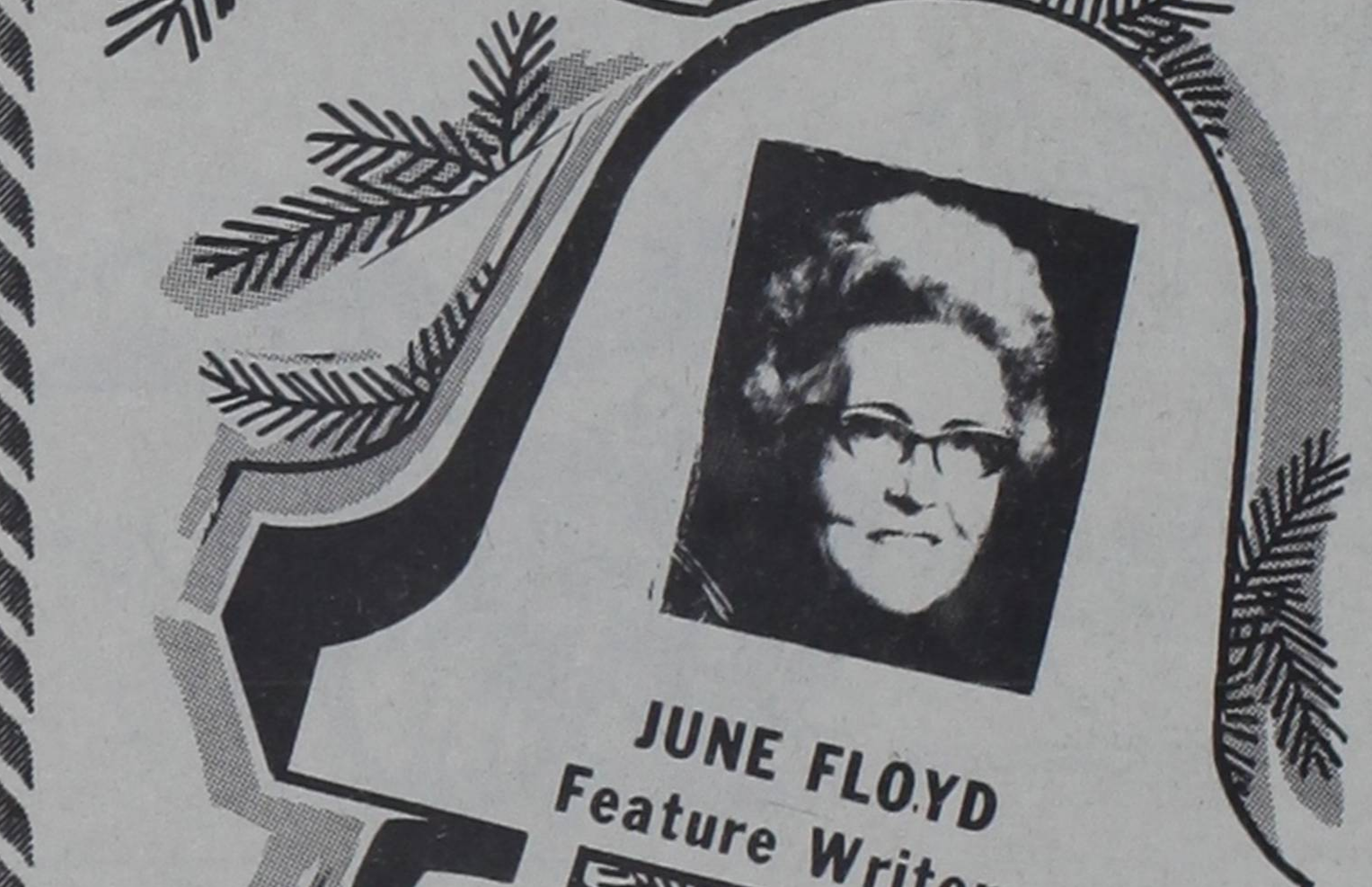
