





"George O'Brian and Harvey Guin last month in the Comstock country got two wolves that had done untold damage to flocks in that section for the last two years. We feel that the loses in that section will be very much lighter with these two big sheep eaters out of the way.

"Last year there were 266 expert hunters in the employ of Uncle Sam and his Bureau of Biological Survey This army of adept riflemen killed trapped and poisoned a total of over 80,000 dangerous predatory animals, including 687 timber wolves, 173 mountain lions, 114 bears, 2,827 bobcats and Canada lynxes and 77,185 covotes. When one considers that the average wolf and mountain liop kills \$1,000 worth of live stock a year; the bobcat or coyote, \$50; and the bear \$500 worth of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs and goats, the vast importance of destroying these range rogues and preventing their ravages becomes immediately apparent.
