FILTRATION PLAN

Plans For Plant And Data Submitted By Consulting Engineer From Dallas to The City Commission.

IS SIMILAR TO OTHER PLANTS

Proposed Plant Has Capacity of Million Gallons Pure Soft Water Daily; -Consumption is 320,000 Gallons.

Proposed plans for the new filtration plant to be installed at Lake Trammell by the city were submitted by George A. Duren, consulting left with members of the city commission by Mr. Duren who returned to Dallas Saturday night.

The plant as outlined by Mr. Duren is standardized filtration plant the one recently completed in Dallas. Weekly Campus at the Southern Meth- in Corsicana and now operating in

It is designed for a million gallon capacity daily. The average daily conumption last year in Sweetwater was 320,000 gallons which would give a two thirds margin for excess use and to provide for growth of the city.

It consists of four settling basins and four filtration tanks, as the main features. In operation the water would pass from the lake to the settling basins first. Here it would be treated with chemicals and allowed to stand for several hours. This precipitates about 98 per cent of the solids held in solution in the water, such as mud, algae or minute water plants. and other sediment. The nature of the visitors from Fort Worth, Mineral chemical used depends upon the nature of the solids held in solution. Alum is very commonly used, how-

The program for the first day will After leaving the settling basins, the water passes through the filtration tanks. These are filled with layers of fine sand, courser sand and finally layers of gravel. Any sediment that remained in the water after the treatment in the settling basins clings to er can then be treated by the chlorine process, if desired, and passes on to

the city mains for consumption. Every few days the flow of water Music-Miss Mary Douthit, Sweet through the filtration tanks proper is reversed to clean the sand from the accumulated sediment. This water is 45 W. F. Junkin, North Kirdgsu Mission, then discharged, being unfit for fur-

ther use. The cost of this installation is about \$35,000. Details incidental to the financing, exact location, etc., have not yet been worked out by the City commission. They are at work on the proposition, however.
