By The United Press. COLORADO, May 16,-In the dis. astrous cyclone which swept south and east of here, along a mile wide path early Monday morning, had han up to twenty-one persons today.

The destructive twister did a propery damage in its wake amounting to an estimated figure of approximately \$2,000,000.

Searches are still going on in the path the storm left, in order that should there be victims they may be properly cared for.

Splinters and matchwood was made of a majority of the homes struck by the cyclone, evidence of which is visible for a disance of miles and miles.

AID GOING TO COLORADO.

The Southwestern Life Insurance Company of Dallas wired Joe Boothe. local representative of Sweetwater. that they were sending \$200 for relief work in Mitchell County.

W. W. Davis of the Sweetwater Mutual was in the field early Monday as soon as the news reached the outside world, but stated that there were no members of his company among the victims of the storm.

A car load of groceries was sent over Tuesday from Sweetwater.




