UNUSUAL.

For West Texas to get enough moisture that somebody else must be flooded out, would seem to be the verdict for the past two years at least, when spring floods have been the rule while West Texas was getting the moisture that means prosperity.

The sooner the state gets busy on that reclamation project, the better it will be for all parts. For if the head waters of the various rivers are dammed up in West Texas, then the disastrous floods that inundate and damage so much of East Texas terrain will be conspicuous by their absence and West Texas will conserve the moisture that now goes to waste and use it profitably later in the season.

Furthermore, it would not require that much water be impounded before there would be noticed a perceptible

change in climate in West Texas. If the draws and arroyos southwest of Sweetwater could be turned into basins then the prevailing southwest winds would pick up moisture in their travels. It would rain more and last but not least, the dry hot winds of July would be conspicuous by their absence. These winds would be laden with moisture, and instead of sucking it from vegetation as it passed, there would be some in the atmosphere for the plants to gather.

This may seem far fetched, but it isn't. Rain is caused by the evaporation of surface water into the atmosphere. This moisture goes up—meets colder air—is condensed into clouds and then into rain. If there is no moisture in the air, there can be no

rain—and there can be no moisture in the air unless there is some place where the winds can get it. And that is the main reason why West Texas should encourage irrigation projects with all its energy. These irrigation projects will benefit the immediate territory reached by them and will also materially change the climate of West Texas for the better.

DROWN IN CANYON

Boy Loses in Palo Duro Canyon Trying To Save His Dog Special to The Reporter.

AMARILLO, June 13.—Attempting to save the life of his dog, Douglas Goodnight, 15, lost his life in the surging waters of the flooded Palo Duro Canyon. The body was carried

downstream and has not been recovered. There was twelve feet of water in the Canyon at the time the boy fell in and the water rose another foot while search for the body was being conducted.

For the first time in the history of Plainview, flooded waters caused damage in the city. Running water draw, normally a dry creek, overflowed its banks early in the week and put three feet of water in the city stock tanks.

HEAT HATCHED 'EM.

unfit for sale. Without ever having been touched, and subjected to the changing temperatures of summer, fall, winter and spring, the eggs have started hatching. Four little chicks have already hopped out of their ancient shells and more are expected.

Millions Added To Automobile Taxes In Central States

CHICAGO, June 12.—Millions of dollars will be forthcoming from the pockets of motorists in a number of middle western states during the coming year as the result of laws passed by legislatures of the winter and spring.

Texas appears to have passed the most radical increase. It is estimated that \$19,500,000 additional will come from the pockets of motorists and wholesalers of gasoline. Two taxing measures dealing with automobiles were passed in Texas. One places a one cent tax on each gallon of gasoline sold by wholesale dealers, while the other revises the present system of motor license fees and increases them approximately 100 per cent. It is estimated that the gasoline tax will net the state \$2,500,000 and the license fee increase will bring \$8,000,000.

Indiana now has a law imposing a tax of two cents a gallon on gasoline, estimated to yield \$3,000,000 yearly. This will be devoted to road road purposes. In addition the legislature has passed a law effective next January 1, increasing the tax on automobiles.

In Oklahoma a tax of 1 cent a gallon on gasoline was included in a bill passed by the legislature. This is expected to yield \$900,000 annually. In Oklahoma City, an ordinance recently passed puts the charge for a city license at 50 cents and is expected to yield \$10,000 to the city.

Tax legislation in Kentucky passed in 1932, which became effective this year is expected to net \$6,000 to the state.

Only one state showed a case. This was in Minnesota where the method of taxing was changed. It was estimated that while the average car tax for last year was \$11.44, however the legislature passed a bill to submit a constitutional amendment to the voters at the next regular election authorizing the legislature to fix a tax on gasoline.

In both Michigan and Iowa a tax of 2 cents a gallon on gasoline was passed by the legislature but vetoed by the governors.

In Iowa a law was passed placing motor bus and truck transportation lines under the supervision of a state railroad commission while a ton-mile tax was imposed on the lines to draw from them a contribution to the state highway maintenance fund. A law was also passed requiring that automobile registration fees be based upon current market prices.

on weight and horsepower of the machine. The charge for a pneumatic truck is 20 cents per 100 pounds of weight and for a solid tired truck 30 cents per 100 pounds. The charge on horsepower of motor is 17 cents.

On a Ford 1-ton truck, for example, the fee will be as follows: Twenty-two horsepower at 17 cents equals \$3.74. Two thousand pounds at 30 cents for pneumatic tires is \$600. Total \$603.74 is \$9.74.

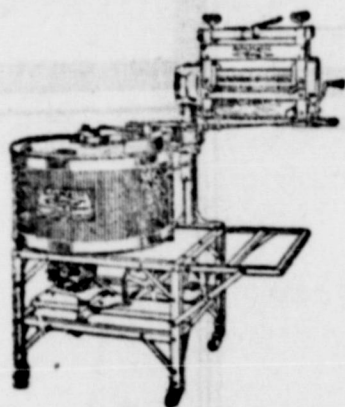
