WASHIUGTON, D. C., June 12 .-The United States to Resourting a reaty with foreign powers which will not only ald in preventing rum runming off the coast of this country out will settle distrons of the forign nations to the recent ruling o the United States Supreme Court regarding the bringing of liquor inside the three-mile limit on trans-Atlantic liners, it was learned today on highest authority.

This treaty would have two broad objects with the nations who accept

It would expand the three-mile limit in connection with the rum running activities which the United States is now destrious of preventing or curb

It would permit vessels of foreign nations who become a party to the treaty to bring liquor rations inside the three-mile limit under seal and for use of the crews of such ships.

ATHENS, Greece, June 13 .- Four Balkan states called their troops to the colors today and rushed reinforce-

ments to their respective borders. Urgent measures are being taken to prevent the Bulgarian revolt from

The mobilization of thousands of fresh troops and news of the civil war raging in Sofia is viewed with the utmost alarm in Belgrade, Bucharest. Athens and Prague,

At Buda-Pesth, the Hungarian capital, it was reported that news of the trouble in Bulgaria had caused much rejoicing and that secret mobilization of troops was taking place.

Greecetoday is instituting war-like measures and rushing reinforcements to the Greek Bulgarian frontier,

Jugo-Slavia has called 1,000 officers from its reserve corps to the colors and is hurrying troops, arms and ammunition to the border.

At Prague it was confirmed that nobs of Bulgarians were acting in defiance of provisions of the treaty signed at the close of the World War which is causing a bad impression in the other Balkan states.






